# RESOLUTION

To provide for expedited Senate consideration of certain nominations subject to advice and consent.

### 2 SECTION 1. PROCEDURE FOR CONSIDERATION.

3 (a) Privileged Nominations; Information Re-

- 4 QUESTED.—Upon receipt by the Senate of a nomination
- 5 described in section 2, the nomination shall—

(1) be placed on the Executive Calendar under
 the heading "Privileged Nominations—Information
 Requested"; and

4 (2) remain on the Executive Calendar under
5 such heading until the Executive Clerk receives a
6 written certification from the Chairman of the com7 mittee of jurisdiction under subsection (b).

8 (b) QUESTIONNAIRES.—The Chairman of the com-9 mittee of jurisdiction shall notify the Executive Clerk in 10 writing when the appropriate biographical and financial 11 questionnaires have been received from an individual nom-12 inated for a position described in section 2.

(c) PRIVILEGED NOMINATIONS; INFORMATION RE14 CEIVED.—Upon receipt of the certification under sub15 section (b), the nomination shall—

16 (1) be placed on the Executive Calendar under
17 the heading "Privileged Nomination—Information
18 Received" and remain on the Executive Calendar
19 under such heading for 10 session days; and

20 (2) after the expiration of the period referred to
21 in paragraph (1), be placed on the "Nominations"
22 section of the Executive Calendar.

(d) REFERRAL TO COMMITTEE OF JURISDICTION.—
24 During the period when a nomination described in sub25 section (a) is listed under the "Privileged Nomination—

Information Requested" section of the Executive Calendar
 described in section (a)(1) or the "Privileged Nomina tion—Information Received" section of the Executive Cal endar described in section (c)(1)—

5 (1) any Senator may request on his or her own
6 behalf, or on the behalf of any identified Senator
7 that the nomination be referred to the appropriate
8 committee of jurisdiction; and

9 (2) if a Senator makes a request described in
10 paragraph (1), the nomination shall be referred to
11 the appropriate committee of jurisdiction.
