Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on Environment and Public Works.

1 *Resolved*, That, in carrying out its powers, duties, and functions under the Standing Rules of the Senate, in ac-2 3 cordance with its jurisdiction under rule XXV of such rules, including holding hearings, reporting such hearings, 4 and making investigations as authorized by paragraphs 1 5 and 8 of rule XXVI of the Standing Rules of the Senate, 6 7 the Committee on Environment and Public Works is au-8 thorized from March 1, 2011, through September 30, 9 2011; October 1, 2011, through September 30, 2012; and 10 October 1, 2012, through February 28, 2013, in its discre-

Mrs. BOXER, from the Committee on Environment and Public Works, reported the following original resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

1 tion (1) to make expenditures from the contingent fund
2 of the Senate, (2) to employ personnel, and (3) with the
3 prior consent of the Government department or agency
4 concerned and the Committee on Rules and Administra5 tion, to use on a reimbursable or nonreimbursable basis
6 the services of personnel of any such department or agen7 cy.

8 SEC. 2(a). The expenses of the committee for the pe-9 riod March 1, 2011, through September 30, 2011, under 10 this resolution shall not exceed \$3,612,391, of which amount (1) not to exceed \$4,666.67 may be expended for 11 the procurement of the services of individual consultants. 12 13 or organizations thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 14 15 72a(i)), and (2) not to exceed \$1,166.67 may be expended for the training of the professional staff of such committee 16 17 (under procedures specified by section 202(j) of that Act). 18 (b) For the period October 1, 2011, through Sep-19 tember 30, 2012, expenses of the committee under this 20resolution shall not exceed \$6,192,669, of which amount 21 (1) not to exceed \$8,000 may be expended for the procure-22 ment of the services of individual consultants, or organiza-23 tions thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legis-24 lative Reorganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 72a(i))), and 25 (2) not to exceed \$2,000 may be expended for the training of the professional staff of such committee (under proce dures specified by section 202(j) of that Act).

3 (c) For the period October 1, 2012, through Feb-4 ruary 28, 2013, expenses of the committee under this resolution shall not exceed \$2,580,278, of which amount (1) 5 not to exceed \$3,333.33 may be expended for the procure-6 7 ment of the services of individual consultants, or organiza-8 tions thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legis-9 lative Reorganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 72a(i))), and 10 (2) not to exceed \$833.33 may be expended for the training of the professional staff of such committee (under pro-11 cedures specified by section 202(j) of that Act). 12

SEC. 3. The committee shall report its findings, together with such recommendations for legislation as it
deems advisable, to the Senate at the earliest practicable
date, but not later than February 28, 2013.

17 SEC. 4. Expenses of the committee under this resolution shall be paid from the contingent fund of the Senate 18 19 upon vouchers approved by the chairman of the com-20 mittee, except that vouchers shall not be required (1) for 21 the disbursement of salaries of employees paid at an an-22 nual rate, or (2) for the payment of telecommunications 23 provided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Door-24 keeper, United States Senate, or (3) for the payment of 25 stationery supplies purchased through the Keeper of the

Stationery, United States Senate, or (4) for payments to 1 2 the Postmaster, United States Senate, or (5) for the payment of metered charges on copying equipment provided 3 4 by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Doorkeeper, 5 United States Senate, or (6) for the payment of Senate Recording and Photographic Services, or (7) for payment 6 7 of franked and mass mail costs by the Sergeant at Arms 8 and Doorkeeper, United States Senate.

9 SEC. 5. There are authorized such sums as may be 10 necessary for agency contributions related to the com-11 pensation of employees of the committee from March 1, 12 2011, through September 30, 2011; October 1, 2011 13 through September 30, 2012; and October 1, 2012, 14 through February 28, 2013, to be paid from the Appro-15 priations account for "Expenses of Inquiries and Inves-16 tigations".

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
