A BILL

To amend title 5, United States Code, to limit the circumstances in which official time may be used by a Federal employee.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Federal Employee Ac-
5 countability Act of 2013”.

1 **SEC. 2. REPEAL OF CERTAIN PROVISIONS RELATING TO OF-**
2 **FICIAL TIME.**

3 Section 7131 of title 5, United States Code, is
4 amended—

5 (1) by striking subsections (a) and (c);

6 (2) by redesignating subsections (b) and (d) as
7 subsections (a) and (b), respectively; and

8 (3) in subsection (b) (as so redesignated by
9 paragraph (2)), by striking “Except as provided in
10 the preceding subsections of this section—” and in-
11 serting “Except as provided in subsection (a)—”.

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
