AN ACT

To amend the Public Health Service Act to reauthorize certain programs relating to traumatic brain injury and to trauma research.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Traumatic Brain In-
3 jury Reauthorization Act of 2014”.

4 **SEC. 2. CDC PROGRAMS FOR PREVENTION AND SURVEIL-**
5 **LANCE OF TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURY.**

6 (a) PREVENTION.—Section 393B(b)(3) of the Public
7 Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 280b–1c(b)(3)) is amended
8 by striking “health-status goals for 2010, commonly re-
9 ferred to as Healthy People 2010” and inserting “health-
10 status goals for 2020, commonly referred to as Healthy
11 People 2020”.

12 (b) SURVEILLANCE.—Subsection (b) of section 393C
13 of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 280b–1d) is
14 amended—

15 (1) by striking “(b) Not later than” and insert-
16 ing the following:

17 “(b) REPORTS.—

18 “(1) INITIAL REPORT.—Not later than”; and

19 (2) by adding at the end the following:

20 “(2) SUBSEQUENT REPORT.—Not later than 24
21 months after the date of enactment of the Trau-
22 matic Brain Injury Reauthorization Act of 2014, the
23 Secretary, acting through the Director of the Cen-
24 ters for Disease Control and Prevention and the Di-
25 rector of the National Institutes of Health and in
26 consultation with the Secretary of Defense and the

1 Secretary of Veterans Affairs, shall submit to the
2 relevant committees of Congress a report that—

3 “(A) identifies which recommendations in
4 the report under paragraph (1) have been
5 adopted and which recommendations in such re-
6 port have not been adopted; and

7 “(B) includes a description of planned ac-
8 tivities to address each recommendation in such
9 report that has not been adopted.”.

10 (c) FUNDING.—Section 394A of the Public Health
11 Service Act (42 U.S.C. 280b–3) is amended—

12 (1) by striking “and” after “1994,”;

13 (2) by striking the second period at the end;
14 and

15 (3) by adding at the end the following: “Of the
16 amounts made available to carry out this part for
17 each of fiscal years 2015 through 2019, there is au-
18 thorized to be appropriated \$6,100,000 to carry out
19 sections 393B and 393C.”.

20 **SEC. 3. STATE GRANTS FOR PROJECTS REGARDING TRAU-**
21 **MATIC BRAIN INJURY.**

22 Section 1252 of the Public Health Service Act (42
23 U.S.C. 300d–52) is amended—

1 (1) in subsection (a), by striking “, acting
2 through the Administrator of the Health Resources
3 and Services Administration,”;

4 (2) in paragraphs (1)(A)(i) and (3)(E) of sub-
5 section (f), by striking “brain injury” and inserting
6 “traumatic brain injury”;

7 (3) in subsection (h), by striking the comma
8 after “under this section” and inserting a comma
9 before “including”; and

10 (4) by amending subsection (j) to read as fol-
11 lows:

12 “(j) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—For
13 carrying out this section and section 1253, there is author-
14 ized to be appropriated \$9,760,000 for each of fiscal years
15 2015 through 2019.”.

16 **SEC. 4. STATE GRANTS FOR PROTECTION AND ADVOCACY**
17 **SERVICES.**

18 Section 1253 of the Public Health Service Act (42
19 U.S.C. 300d–53) is amended—

20 (1) in subsection (a), by striking “, acting
21 through the Administrator of the Health Resources
22 and Services Administration (referred to in this sec-
23 tion as the ‘Administrator’),”;

(2) in subsections (c), (d)(1), (e)(1), (e)(4), (g), (h), and (j)(1), by striking “Administrator” each place it appears and inserting “Secretary”;

(3) in subsection (h)—

(A) by striking the subsection heading and inserting “REPORTING”;

(B) by striking “Each protection and advocacy system” and inserting the following:

“(1) REPORTS BY SYSTEMS.—Each protection and advocacy system”; and

(C) by adding at the end the following:

“(2) REPORT BY SECRETARY.—Not later than 1 year after the date of enactment of the Traumatic Brain Injury Reauthorization Act of 2014, the Secretary shall prepare and submit to the appropriate committees of Congress a report describing the services and activities carried out under this section during the period for which the report is being prepared.”.

(4) in subsection (i)—

(A) by striking “Administrator of the Health Resources and Services Administration” and inserting “Secretary”; and

(B) by striking “by the Administrator” and inserting “by the Secretary”;

1 (5) in subsection (k), by striking “subtitle C”
2 and inserting “subtitle C of title I”;
3 (6) by striking subsection (l) (relating to au-
4 thorization of appropriations); and
5 (7) by redesignating subsection (m) as sub-
6 section (l).
