Mr. MCNERNEY introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce

A BILL

To provide for the establishment of a grant program to assist State and local governments to install solar energy systems.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Solar Energy Deploy-
5 ment Act of 2013”.

6 **SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.**

7 In this Act:

8 (1) **QUALIFYING SOLAR EQUIPMENT.**—The
9 term “qualifying solar equipment” means property

1 described in clause (i) or (ii) of section 48(a)(3)(A)
2 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

3 (2) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means
4 the Secretary of Energy.

5 (3) STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS.—The
6 term “State and local governments” includes mu-
7 nicipalities, counties, transit agencies, school dis-
8 tricts, water districts, Indian tribes, and territories.
9 Such term does not include an entity eligible for a
10 credit allowed under section 48 of the Internal Rev-
11 enue Code of 1986 with respect to qualifying solar
12 equipment.

13 **SEC. 3. SOLAR ENERGY GRANT PROGRAM.**

14 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—The Secretary shall establish
15 a program to award grants, on a competitive basis, to
16 State and local governments for the design, purchase, and
17 installation of qualifying solar equipment on rooftops or
18 parking structures owned by the State or local govern-
19 ment.

20 (b) COMPETITIVE CRITERIA.—In determining which
21 State and local governments to award grants to under this
22 section, the Secretary shall consider—

23 (1) the speed with which solar energy systems
24 can be deployed;

1 (2) the total amount of solar energy to be de-
2 ployed;

3 (3) the financial need of the State or local gov-
4 ernment;

5 (4) the use of best practices to ensure max-
6 imum efficiency of deployed systems;

7 (5) the use of materials and components that
8 are manufactured in the United States; and

9 (6) other criteria the Secretary considers rel-
10 evant.

11 **SEC. 4. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

12 There are authorized to be appropriated to the Sec-
13 retary for carrying out this Act \$150,000,000 for each of
14 the fiscal years 2014 through 2018.

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
