Mr. GOSAR introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Natural Resources

A BILL

To provide for transparency and reporting related to direct and indirect costs incurred by the Bonneville Power Administration, the Western Area Power Administration, the Southwestern Power Administration, and the Southeastern Power Administration related to compliance with any Federal environmental laws impacting the conservation of fish and wildlife, and for other purposes.

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Environmental Compli-
3 ance Cost Transparency Act of 2013”.

4 **SEC. 2. TRANSPARENCY AND REPORTING.**

5 (a) INFORMATION INCLUDED IN MONTHLY BILLING
6 TO POWER CUSTOMERS.—The Administrators of each of
7 the Bonneville Power Administration, the Western Area
8 Power Administration, the Southwestern Power Adminis-
9 tration, and the Southeastern Power Administration shall
10 include in monthly billings sent to each of their power cus-
11 tomers information estimating and reporting the costs of
12 the customer’s share of the direct and indirect costs in-
13 curred by the administration related to compliance with
14 any Federal environmental laws impacting the conserva-
15 tion of fish and wildlife considered by the Administrator
16 concerned, at that Administrator’s sole discretion after
17 consultation with consumers, to be relevant.

18 (b) DIRECT COSTS.—Direct costs reported under this
19 section shall include Federal agency obligations related to
20 costs of studies; capital, operation, maintenance, and re-
21 placement costs; and staffing costs.

22 (c) INDIRECT COSTS.—Indirect costs reported under
23 this section shall include foregone generation and replace-
24 ment power costs, including the net costs of any trans-
25 mission.

1 (d) COORDINATION.—The Commissioner of the Bu-
2 reau of Reclamation and the head of any other affected
3 Federal agency shall assist the Administrators with the
4 identification of the costs.

5 (e) REPORT.—No later than January 30 of each
6 year, each of the Administrators referred to in subsection
7 (a), in coordination with the Bureau of Reclamation and
8 other affected Federal agencies, shall provide an annual
9 report to the appropriate committees of the House of Rep-
10 resentatives and the Senate estimating the total of the di-
11 rect and indirect costs incurred by the administration re-
12 lated to compliance with any Federal environmental laws
13 impacting the conservation of fish and wildlife, the sources
14 of replacement power, and costs related to integrating
15 wind energy resources considered by the Administrator
16 concerned, at that Administrator's sole discretion after
17 consultation with consumers, to be relevant.

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
