Ms. HANABUSA introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on Financial Services

A BILL

To reauthorize the programs of the Department of Housing
and Urban Development for housing assistance for Na-
tive Hawaiians.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Hawaiian Homeowner-
5 ship Opportunity Act of 2013”.

6 **SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS FOR HOUS-**
7 **ING ASSISTANCE.**

8 Section 824 of the Native American Housing Assist-
9 ance and Self-Determination Act of 1996 (25 U.S.C.
10 4243), as added by section 513 of Public Law 106–569

1 (114 Stat. 2969), is amended by striking “fiscal years”
 2 and all that follows and inserting the following: “fiscal
 3 years 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, and 2017.”.

4 **SEC. 3. LOAN GUARANTEES FOR NATIVE HAWAIIAN HOUS-**
 5 **ING.**

6 Section 184A of the Housing and Community Devel-
 7 opment Act of 1992 (12 U.S.C. 1715z–13b), as added by
 8 section 514 of Public Law 106–569 (114 Stat. 2989), is
 9 amended as follows:

10 (1) **AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**—In
 11 subsection (j)(7), by striking “fiscal years” and all
 12 that follows and inserting the following: “fiscal years
 13 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, and 2017.”.

14 (2) **AUTHORITY.**—In subsection (b), by striking
 15 “or as a result of a lack of access to private finan-
 16 cial markets”.

17 (3) **ELIGIBLE HOUSING.**—In subsection (c), by
 18 striking paragraph (2) and inserting the following
 19 new paragraph:

20 “(2) **ELIGIBLE HOUSING.**—The loan will be
 21 used to construct, acquire, refinance, or rehabilitate
 22 1- to 4-family dwellings that are standard housing
 23 and are located on Hawaiian Home Lands.”.

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
