Mr. GIBSON (for himself, Mr. WELCH, Mrs. BACHMANN, Mr. NOLAN, Mr. DUNCAN of South Carolina, Mr. DESJARLAIS, and Mr. JONES) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs, and in addition to the Committees on Armed Services and Select Intelligence (Permanent Select), for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

A BILL

To restrict funds related to escalating United States military
involvement in Syria.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Protecting Americans
5 from the Proliferation of Weapons to Terrorists Act of
6 2013”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON FUNDS TO ESCALATE UNITED**
2 **STATES MILITARY INVOLVEMENT IN SYRIA.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided under sub-
4 section (b), no funds made available to the Central Intel-
5 ligence Agency, the Department of Defense, or any other
6 agency or entity of the United States involved in intel-
7 ligence activities may be obligated or expended for the pur-
8 pose of, or in a manner which would have the effect of,
9 supporting, directly or indirectly, military or paramilitary
10 operations in Syria by any nation, group, organization,
11 movement, or individual.

12 (b) EXCEPTION.—The prohibition under subsection
13 (a) does not apply to funds obligated for non-lethal hu-
14 manitarian assistance for the Syrian people provided di-
15 rectly by the United States Government, through non-
16 governmental organizations and contractors, or through
17 foreign governments.

18 (c) DURATION OF PROHIBITION.—The prohibition
19 under subsection (a) shall cease to apply only if a joint
20 resolution approving assistance for military or para-
21 military operations in Syria is enacted.

22 (d) QUARTERLY REPORTS.—Not later than 90 days
23 after the date of the enactment of this Act, and every 90
24 days thereafter, the Secretary of State shall submit to
25 Congress a report on assistance provided to groups, orga-
26 nizations, movements, and individuals in Syria.

1 (e) NON-LETHAL HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE DE-
2 FINED.—In this Act, the term “non-lethal humanitarian
3 assistance” means humanitarian assistance that is not
4 weapons, ammunition, or other equipment or material that
5 is designed to inflict serious bodily harm or death.
