3 **SECTION 1. LOSS OF ELIGIBILITY FOR HAZING CRIME CON-**
4 **VITION.**

5 Section 484 of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20
6 U.S.C. 1091) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
7 lowing:

8 “(u) **LOSS OF ELIGIBILITY FOR HAZING CRIME CON-**
9 **VITION.**—No student who is convicted of a criminal haz-

- 1 ing offense under State law shall be eligible to receive any
- 2 grant, loan, or work assistance under this title.”.
