A BILL

To amend the Small Business Act to provide for improvements to small business development centers.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 *This Act may be cited as the “Small Business Develop-*
5 *ment Centers Improvement Act of 2014”.*

6 **SEC. 2. USE OF AUTHORIZED ENTREPRENEURIAL DEVELOP-**

7 **MENT PROGRAMS.**

8 *The Small Business Act (15 U.S.C. 631 et seq.) is*
9 *amended by adding at the end the following:*

10 **“SEC. 48. USE OF AUTHORIZED ENTREPRENEURIAL DEVELO-**
11 **PMENT PROGRAMS.**

12 “(a) EXPANDED SUPPORT FOR ENTREPRENEURS.—
13 “(1) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other
14 provision of law, the Administrator shall only use the
15 programs authorized in sections 7(j), 7(m), 8(a),
16 8(b)(1), 21, 22, 29, and 32 of this Act, and sections
17 358 and 389 of the Small Business Investment Act to
18 deliver entrepreneurial development services, entrepre-
19 neurial education, business incubation services,
20 growth acceleration services, support for the develop-
21 ment and maintenance of clusters, or business train-
22 ing.

23 “(2) EXCEPTION.—This section shall not apply
24 to services provided to assist small business concerns
25 owned by an Indian tribe.

1 “(b) ANNUAL REPORT.—Beginning on the first Decem-
2 ber 1 after the date of enactment of this subsection, the Ad-
3 ministrator shall annually report to the Committee on
4 Small Business of the House of Representatives and the
5 Committee on Small Business and Entrepreneurship of the
6 Senate on all entrepreneurial development activities under-
7 taken in the current fiscal year. This report shall include—
8 “(1) a description and operating details for each
9 program and activity;

10 “(2) operating circulars, manuals, and standard
11 operating procedures for each program and activity;

12 “(3) a description of the process used to award
13 grants under each program and activity;

14 “(4) a list of all awardees, contractors, and ven-
15 dors (including organization name and location) and
16 the amount of awards for the current fiscal year for
17 each program and activity;

18 “(5) the amount of funding obligated for the cur-
19 rent fiscal year for each program and activity; and

20 “(6) the names and titles for those individuals
21 responsible for each program and activity.”.

22 **SEC. 3. MARKETING OF SERVICES.**

23 Section 21 of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C. 648)
24 is amended by adding at the end the following:

1 “(o) NO PROHIBITION OF MARKETING OF SERVICES.—
2 *The Administrator shall not prohibit applicants receiving
3 grants under this section from marketing and advertising
4 their services to individuals and small businesses.”.*

5 **SEC. 4. CONFIDENTIALITY REQUIREMENTS.**

6 *Section 21(a)(7)(A) of the Small Business Act (15
7 U.S.C. 648(a)(7)(A)) is amended by inserting after “under
8 this section” the following: “to any State, local or Federal
9 agency or third party”.*

10 **SEC. 5. DATA COLLECTION.**

11 *(a) IN GENERAL.—Section 21(a)(3)(A) of the Small
12 Business Act (15 U.S.C. 648(a)(3)(A)) is amended—*

13 *(1) in clause (ii), by striking “as provided in
14 this section and” and inserting “as provided in this
15 section,”; and*

16 *(2) by inserting before the period at the end the
17 following: “, and (iv) governing data collection activi-
18 ties related to applicants receiving grants under this
19 section”.*

20 *(b) ANNUAL REPORT ON DATA COLLECTION.—Section
21 21 of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C. 648), as amended
22 by section 3 of this Act, is further amended by adding at
23 the end the following:*

24 *“(p) ANNUAL REPORT ON DATA COLLECTION.—The
25 Administrator shall report annually to the Committee on*

1 *Small Business of the House of Representatives and the*
2 *Committee on Small Business and Entrepreneurship of the*
3 *Senate on data collection activities related to the Small*
4 *Business Development Center program.”.*

5 **SEC. 6. MATCHMAKING AND OTHER EVENTS.**

6 *Section 21(a)(3)(C) of the Small Business Act (15*
7 *U.S.C. 648(a)(3)(C)) is amended to read as follows:*

8 *“(C) Such participation in private partnerships*
9 *and cosponsorships with the Administration shall not*
10 *limit Small Business Development Centers from col-*
11 *lecting fees or other income related to the operation*
12 *of such partnerships and cosponsorships.”.*

13 **SEC. 7. EQUITY FOR SBDCS.**

14 *Section 21(a)(4)(C)(v)(I) of the Small Business Act*
15 *(15 U.S.C. 648(a)(4)(C)(v)(I)) is amended—*

16 *(1) in item (aa), by striking “; and” and insert-*
17 *ing a period; and*
18 *(2) by striking item (bb).*

19 **SEC. 8. AWARD OF GRANTS TO SBDCS.**

20 *Section 21 of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C. 648),*
21 *as amended by sections 3 and 5 of this Act, is further*
22 *amended by adding at the end the following:*

23 *“(q) LIMITATION ON AWARD OF GRANTS.—Except for*
24 *not-for-profit institutions of higher education, notwithstanding*
25 *any provision of law, the Administrator shall not*

1 award grants (including contracts and cooperative agree-
2 ments) under this section to any entity other than those
3 that received grants (including contracts and cooperative
4 agreements) under this section prior to September 30, 2014,
5 and that seek to renew such grants (including contracts and
6 cooperative agreements) after such date.”.

7 **SEC. 9. DISASTER REFORMS.**

8 Section 21(b)(3) of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C.
9 648(b)(3)) is amended—

10 (1) by striking “(3) At the discretion” and in-
11 serting the following:

12 “(3) ASSISTANCE TO OUT-OF-STATE SMALL BUSI-
13 NESSES.—

14 “(A) IN GENERAL.—At the discretion”; and
15 (2) by adding at the end the following:

16 “(B) DISASTER RECOVERY ASSISTANCE.—

17 “(i) IN GENERAL.—At the discretion of
18 the Administrator, the Administrator may
19 authorize a small business development cen-
20 ter to provide assistance, as described in
21 subsection (c), to a small business concern
22 located outside of the State, without regard
23 to geographic proximity, if the small busi-
24 ness concern is located in an area for which
25 the President has declared a major disaster

1 *under section 401 of the Robert T. Stafford
2 Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance
3 Act (42 U.S.C. 5170), during the period of
4 the declaration.*

5 “(ii) *CONTINUITY OF SERVICES.*—A
6 *small business development center that pro-*
7 *vides counselors to an area described in*
8 *clause (i) shall, to the maximum extent*
9 *practicable, ensure continuity of services in*
10 *any State in which the small business devel-*
11 *opment center otherwise provides services.*

12 “(iii) *ACCESS TO DISASTER RECOVERY*
13 *FACILITIES.*—*For purposes of this subpara-*
14 *graph, the Administrator shall, to the max-*
15 *imum extent practicable, permit the per-*
16 *sonnel of a small business development cen-*
17 *ter to use any site or facility designated by*
18 *the Administrator for use to provide dis-*
19 *aster recovery assistance.”.*

20 **SEC. 10. INCLUSIONS OF ENTREPRENEURSHIP TRAINING**
21 **FOR UNEMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS.**

22 *Section 21(c)(3)(A) of the Small Business Act (15*
23 *U.S.C. 648(c)(3)(A)) is amended—*

24 *(1) in clause (iii), by striking “and” at the end;*

1 (2) in clause (iv), by inserting “and” at the end;

2 *and*

3 (3) by adding at the end the following:

4 “(v) educating unemployed individuals on
5 entrepreneurship and working with such individ-
6 uals to start new businesses;”.

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
