A BILL

To provide for the eligibility of the Republic of Korea for the license exception for encryption commodities, software and technology under the Export Administration Regulations.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Korea Security Part-
5 nership Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. ELIGIBILITY OF REPUBLIC OF KOREA FOR LICENSE**
2 **EXCEPTION FOR ENCRYPTION COMMOD-**
3 **ITIES, SOFTWARE AND TECHNOLOGY UNDER**
4 **THE EXPORT ADMINISTRATION REGULA-**
5 **TIONS.**

6 (a) FINDING.—Congress finds that the Republic of
7 Korea has adopted high standards in the field of export
8 controls, and that it is a member of all four multilateral
9 export control regimes: the Australia Group, the Missile
10 Technology Control Regime, the Nuclear Suppliers Group,
11 and the Wassenaar Arrangement.

12 (b) LICENSE EXCEPTION.—Effective beginning on
13 the date that is 180 days after the date of the enactment
14 of this Act, the Republic of Korea shall be deemed to be
15 a country listed in Supplement No. 3 to part 740 of title
16 15, Code of Federal Regulations (relating to license excep-
17 tion for encryption commodities, software and technology
18 (ENC) favorable treatment countries), or any successor
19 to such Supplement, for purposes of carrying out part 740
20 of title 15, Code of Federal Regulations.

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
