A BILL

To expand the HUBZone program for communities affected
by base realignment and closure, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “HUBZone Expansion
5 Act of 2013”.

6 **SEC. 2. EXPANDING HUBZONE PROGRAM FOR COMMU-**
7 **NITIES AFFECTED BY BASE REALIGNMENT**
8 **AND CLOSURE.**

9 Section 3(p)(4)(D) of the Small Business Act (15
10 U.S.C. 632(p)(4)(D)) is amended—

1 (1) in clause (iv), by striking the period at the
2 end and inserting “; and”;

3 (2) by redesignating clauses (i), (ii), (iii), and
4 (iv) as subclauses (I), (II), (III), and (IV), respec-
5 tively, and moving the margins 2 ems to the right;

6 (3) in the matter preceding subclause (I), as so
7 redesignated, by striking “means lands within” and
8 inserting the following: “means—

9 “(i) lands within”; and

10 (4) by adding at the end the following:

11 “(ii) a geographic area that—

12 “(I) is—

13 “(aa) the municipality in
14 which the military installation is
15 located;

16 “(bb) the county in which
17 the military installation is lo-
18 cated; or

19 “(cc)(AA) the census tract
20 in which the military installation
21 is located; or

22 “(BB) the census tract in
23 which the military installation is
24 located and a census tract contig-
25 uous to that census tract; and

1 “(II) has a total population of
2 not more than 50,000, as determined
3 with reference to the most recent de-
4 cennial census.”.

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
