Mr. MEEKS introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

A BILL

To amend the FAA Modernization and Reform Act of 2012 to prohibit the flying of unmanned recreational aircraft near commercial airports.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Responsible Skies Act
5 of 2014”.

6 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON THE FLYING OF UNMANNED REC-**
7 **REATIONAL AIRCRAFT NEAR COMMERCIAL**
8 **AIRPORTS.**

9 Section 333 of the FAA Modernization and Reform
10 Act of 2012 (49 U.S.C. 40101 note) is amended—

1 (1) in subsection (c) by striking the period at
2 the end and inserting “, including that the operator
3 of an unmanned recreational aircraft may not fly the
4 aircraft—

5 “(1) above 400 feet and within 5 miles of the perim-
6 eter of an airport that provides scheduled passenger air
7 transportation; or

8 “(2) where it may be seen from the perimeter of the
9 airport.”.

10 (2) by inserting at the end the following:

11 “(d) REPORT TO CONGRESS.—Not later than one
12 year after the date of the enactment of this Act, and every
13 year thereafter, the Secretary shall submit to Congress a
14 report containing—

15 “(1) a description of any incident in which an
16 unmanned recreational aircraft flew above 400 feet
17 less than 5 miles from the perimeter of an airport
18 that provides scheduled passenger air transportation;
19 and

20 “(2) the action taken by the Secretary in re-
21 sponse to the incident.

22 “(e) DEFINITION OF UNMANNED RECREATIONAL
23 AIRCRAFT.—In this section, the term ‘unmanned rec-

- 1 recreational aircraft' means an unmanned aircraft flown for
- 2 hobby or recreational purposes.”.
