Mr. HONDA submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules

RESOLUTION

Providing for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 233) to amend chapter 31 of title 31, United States Code, to provide for an orderly process by which the debt ceiling is increased.

1 *Resolved*, That immediately upon adoption of this res-
2 olution, the House shall proceed to the consideration in
3 the House of the bill (H.R. 233) to amend chapter 31
4 of title 31, United States Code, to provide for an orderly
5 process by which the debt ceiling is increased. All points
6 of order against consideration of the bill are waived. The
7 bill shall be considered as read. All points of order against
8 provisions in the bill are waived. The previous question

1 shall be considered as ordered on the bill and on any
2 amendment thereto to final passage without intervening
3 motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided and
4 controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of
5 the Committee on Ways and Means; (2) a proper amend-
6 ment in the nature of a substitute consistent with the bill
7 (S. 1569, the “Default Prevention Act of 2013”) to ensure
8 the complete and timely payment of the obligations of the
9 United States Government until December 31, 2014, if
10 offered by Representative Honda of California or his des-
11 ignee, which shall be in order without intervention of any
12 point of order except for those arising under clause 7 of
13 rule XVI, shall be considered as read, and shall be sepa-
14 rately debatable for one hour equally divided and con-
15 trolled by the proponent and an opponent; and (3) one
16 motion to recommit with or without instructions.

17 SEC. 2. Clause 1(c) of rule XIX shall not apply to
18 the consideration of H.R. 233 as provided for in the first
19 section of this resolution.
