Mr. TOOMEY introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs

A BILL

To require the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to conduct a study on matters relating to the claiming and interring of unclaimed remains of veterans, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Dignified Interment
5 of Our Veterans Act of 2013”.

1 **SEC. 2. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS STUDY ON**
2 **MATTERS RELATING TO CLAIMING AND**
3 **INTERRING UNCLAIMED REMAINS OF VET-**
4 **ERANS.**

5 (a) **STUDY AND REPORT REQUIRED.**—Not later than
6 one year after the date of the enactment of this Act, the
7 Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall—

8 (1) complete a study on matters relating to the
9 identification, claiming, and interring of unclaimed
10 remains of veterans; and

11 (2) submit to Congress a report on the findings
12 of the Secretary with respect to the study required
13 under paragraph (1).

14 (b) **MATTERS STUDIED.**—The matters studied under
15 subsection (a)(1) shall include the following:

16 (1) Determining the scope of issues relating to
17 unclaimed remains of veterans, including an esti-
18 mate of the number of unclaimed remains of vet-
19 erans on the day before the date of the enactment
20 of this Act.

21 (2) Assessing the effectiveness of the proce-
22 dures of the Department of Veterans Affairs for
23 claiming and interring unclaimed remains of vet-
24 erans.

1 (3) Identifying and assessing State and local
2 laws that affect the ability of the Secretary to iden-
3 tify, claim, and inter unclaimed remains of veterans.

4 (4) Developing recommendations for such legis-
5 lative or administrative action as the Secretary con-
6 siders appropriate.
