A BILL

To expand benefits to the families of public safety officers who suffer fatal climate-related injuries sustained in the line of duty and proximately resulting in death.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Fairness for Fallen
5 Officers Act of 2014”.

1 **SEC. 2. BENEFITS FOR FAMILIES OF PUBLIC SAFETY OFFI-**
 2 **CERS WHO SUFFER FATAL CLIMATE-RE-**
 3 **LATED INJURIES.**

4 Section 1201 of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe
 5 Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. 3796) is amended—

6 (1) in subsection (k)—

7 (A) in the matter preceding paragraph (1),
 8 by striking “or vascular rupture” and inserting
 9 “vascular rupture, or climate-related injury”;

10 (B) in paragraph (1)(A), by inserting “ex-
 11 posure to extreme environmental conditions,”
 12 after “disaster relief,”;

13 (C) in paragraph (2), by striking “or vas-
 14 cular rupture” and inserting “vascular rupture,
 15 or climate-related injury”;

16 (D) in paragraph (3), by striking “or vas-
 17 cular rupture” and inserting “vascular rupture,
 18 or climate-related injury”; and

19 (E) in the flush text following paragraph
 20 (3), by striking “or vascular rupture” and in-
 21 serting “vascular rupture, or climate-related in-
 22 jury”; and

23 (2) by amending subsection (l) to read as fol-
 24 lows:

25 “(l) For purposes of subsection (k)—

1 “(1) the term ‘climate-related injury’ means an
2 injury that is caused by an environmental condition
3 experienced by an officer, including hypothermia,
4 heatstroke, and hyperthermia; and

5 “(2) the term ‘nonroutine stressful or strenuous
6 physical’ excludes actions of a clerical, administra-
7 tive, or nonmanual nature.”.

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
