Mr. COBURN introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred
to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs

A BILL

To strengthen Inspector General audits and investigations
by streamlining computer matching agreements.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Inspectors General
5 Streamlining Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. COMPUTER MATCHING AGREEMENTS.**

7 Section 6 of the Inspector General Act of 1978 (5
8 U.S.C. App.) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
9 lowing:

1 “(g)(1) In this subsection, the terms ‘agency’,
2 ‘matching program’, and ‘record’ have the meanings given
3 those terms in section 552a(a) of title 5, United States
4 Code.

5 “(2) In addition to the authority otherwise provided
6 by this Act, each Inspector General, in conducting an
7 audit, investigation, inspection, evaluation, or other review
8 authorized under this Act, may compare any records with
9 other records or non-Federal records.

10 “(3) For purposes of section 552a of title 5, United
11 States Code, or any other provision of law, a comparison
12 of records with other records or non-Federal records per-
13 formed by an Inspector General or by an agency partici-
14 pating with an Inspector General under the authority de-
15 scribed in paragraph (2) shall not be considered a ‘match-
16 ing program’.”.

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
