Mr. PAUL (for himself, Mr. McCONNELL, Mr. VITTER, and Mr. JOHANNES) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs

A BILL

To make participation in the American Community Survey voluntary, except with respect to certain basic questions, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PARTICIPATION IN AMERICAN COMMUNITY**
4 **SURVEY.**

5 (a) **OPTIONAL QUESTIONS.**—Section 193 of title 13,
6 United States Code, is amended by adding at the end the
7 following: “The Secretary shall include, in the instructions
8 for completing any survey authorized under this section,
9 a statement indicating that answering any question other

1 than questions that solicit the information described in
 2 section 221(c)(2)(A) is optional.”.

3 (b) REFUSAL TO PARTICIPATE.—Section 221 of title
 4 13, United States Code, is amended—

5 (1) in subsection (a), by striking “Whoever,
 6 being over eighteen years of age,” and inserting
 7 “Except as provided in subsection (c), any person
 8 older than 18 years of age who”; and

9 (2) by amending subsection (c) to read as fol-
 10 lows:

11 “(c)(1) Notwithstanding any other provision under
 12 this title—

13 “(A) no person may be compelled to disclose in-
 14 formation relative to the person’s religious beliefs or
 15 to membership in a religious body; and

16 “(B) except as provided in paragraph (2), no
 17 person may be fined or otherwise compelled to an-
 18 swer questions in connection with the survey, con-
 19 ducted by the Secretary of Commerce, which is com-
 20 monly referred to as the ‘American Community Sur-
 21 vey’.

22 “(2) Paragraph (1)(B)—

23 “(A) shall not apply to any question that elie-
 24 its—

25 “(i) the name of the respondent;

1 “(ii) contact information for the respond-
2 ent;
3 “(iii) the date of the response; or
4 “(iv) the number of people living or stay-
5 ing at the same address; and
6 “(B) does not waive any penalty imposed for
7 conduct described in subsection (b).”.

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
