Mr. REED (for himself and Mr. WHITEHOUSE) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation

A BILL

To amend the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act to add Rhode Island to the Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Council.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Rhode Island Fisher-
5 men’s Fairness Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

7 Congress makes the following findings:

8 (1) Rhode Island fishermen participate in fish-
9 eries managed by the New England Fishery Man-

agement Council (hereinafter referred to as the
 “NEFMC”) and the Mid-Atlantic Fishery Manage-
 ment Council (hereinafter referred to as the
 “MAFMC”).

(2) Rhode Island currently has voting member-
 ship on the NEFMC under the Magnuson-Stevens
 Fishery Conservation and Management Act but does
 not have voting membership on the MAFMC.

(3) Rhode Island lands more MAFMC-managed
 stocks than any other MAFMC member except the
 State of New Jersey.

(4) A higher percentage of Rhode Island’s com-
 mercial landings (by weight or value) traditionally
 have come from species that are managed by the
 MAFMC as compared to species managed by
 NEFMC.

(5) MAFMC has found that Rhode Island’s cir-
 cumstance parallels that of Florida and North Caro-
 lina, which each have voting membership on two dif-
 ferent fishery management councils.

**SEC. 3. ADDITION OF RHODE ISLAND TO THE MID-ATLAN-
 TIC FISHERY MANAGEMENT COUNCIL.**

Section 302(a)(1)(B) of the Magnuson-Stevens Fish-
 ery Conservation and Management Act (16 U.S.C.
 1852(a)(1)(B)) is amended—

1 (1) by inserting “Rhode Island,” after “States
2 of”;

3 (2) by inserting “Rhode Island,” after “except
4 North Carolina,”;

5 (3) by striking “21” and inserting “23”; and

6 (4) by striking “13” and inserting “14”.
