Mr. BEGICH introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs

A BILL

To require the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to allow public access to research of the Department, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Veterans Affairs Re-
5 search Transparency Act of 2013”.

6 **SEC. 2. PUBLIC ACCESS TO DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS**

7 **AFFAIRS RESEARCH AND DATA SHARING BE-**
8 **TWEEN DEPARTMENTS.**

9 (a) ESTABLISHMENT OF INTERNET WEBSITE.—The
10 Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall make available on an

1 Internet website of the Department of Veterans Affairs
2 available to the public the following:

3 (1) Data files that contain information on re-
4 search of the Department.

5 (2) A data dictionary on each data file.

6 (3) Instructions for how to obtain access to
7 each data file for use in research.

8 (b) PUBLIC ACCESS TO MANUSCRIPTS ON DEPART-
9 MENT FUNDED RESEARCH.—

10 (1) IN GENERAL.—Beginning not later than
11 540 days after the date of the enactment of this Act,
12 the Secretary shall require, as a condition on the use
13 of any data gathered or formulated from research
14 funded by the Department, that any final, peer-re-
15 viewed manuscript prepared for publication that
16 uses such data be submitted to the Secretary for de-
17 posit in the digital archive established under para-
18 graph (2) and publication under paragraph (3).

19 (2) ESTABLISHMENT OF DIGITAL ARCHIVE.—
20 Not later than 540 days after the date of the enact-
21 ment of this Act, the Secretary shall establish a dig-
22 ital archive consisting of manuscripts described in
23 paragraph (1).

24 (3) PUBLIC AVAILABILITY.—

1 (A) AVAILABILITY OF ARCHIVE.—The Sec-
2 retary shall make the digital archive established
3 under paragraph (2) and the contents of such
4 archive available to the public via a publicly ac-
5 cessible Internet website at not cost to the pub-
6 lic.

7 (B) AVAILABILITY OF MANUSCRIPTS.—The
8 Secretary shall ensure that each manuscript
9 submitted to the Secretary under paragraph (1)
10 is available to the public under subparagraph
11 (A) not later than one year after the official
12 date on which the manuscript is otherwise pub-
13 lished.

14 (4) CONSISTENT WITH COPYRIGHT LAW.—The
15 Secretary shall carry out this subsection in a man-
16 ner consistent with applicable copyright law.

17 (5) ANNUAL REPORT.—

18 (A) IN GENERAL.—Not later than one year
19 after the date the Secretary begins making
20 manuscripts available to the public under this
21 subsection and not less frequently than once
22 each year thereafter, the Secretary shall submit
23 to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the
24 Senate and the Committee on Veterans' Affairs
25 of the House of Representatives a report on the

1 implementation of this subsection during the
2 most recent one-year period.

3 (B) CONTENTS.—Each report submitted
4 under subparagraph (A) shall include for the
5 period of the report:

6 (i) The number of manuscripts sub-
7 mitted under paragraph (1).

8 (ii) The titles of such manuscripts.

9 (iii) The authors of such manuscripts.

10 (iv) For each such manuscript, the
11 name and issue number or volume number,
12 as the case may be, of the journal or other
13 publication in which such manuscript was
14 published.

15 (c) RECOMMENDATIONS FOR DATA SHARING BE-
16 TWEEN DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS AND DE-
17 PARTMENT OF DEFENSE.—Not later than one year after
18 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Department of
19 Veterans Affairs-Department of Defense Joint Executive
20 Committee established by section 320(a) of title 38,
21 United States Code, shall submit to the Secretary of Vet-
22 erans Affairs and the Secretary of Defense options and
23 recommendations for establishment of a program for long-
24 term cooperation and data-sharing between and within the
25 Department of Veterans Affairs and the Department of

1 Defense to facilitate research on outcomes of military serv-
2 ice, readjustment after combat deployment, and other top-
3 ics of importance to the following:

4 (1) Veterans.

5 (2) Members of the Armed Forces.

6 (3) Family members of veterans.

7 (4) Family members of members of the Armed
8 Forces.

9 (5) Members of communities that have a sig-
10 nificant population of veterans or members of the
11 Armed Forces.

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
