RESOLUTION

Relative to the memorial observances of the Honorable Frank
R. Lautenberg, late a Senator from the State of New Jersey.

Whereas, The Senate has heard with profound sorrow and
deep regret the announcement of the death of the Honor-
able Frank R. Lautenberg, late a Senator from the State
of New Jersey: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That the memorial observances of the Hon-
2 orable Frank R. Lautenberg, late a Senator from the
3 State of New Jersey be held in the Senate Chamber on
4 Thursday, June 6, 2013, beginning at 2:00 p.m., and that
5 the Senate attend the same.

6 *Resolved*, That paragraph 1 of Rule IV of the Rules
7 for the Regulation of the Senate Wing of the United

1 States Capitol (prohibiting the taking of pictures in the
2 Senate Chamber) be temporarily suspended for the sole
3 and specific purpose of permitting the Senate Photo-
4 graphic Studio to photograph this memorial observance.

5 *Resolved*, That the Sergeant at Arms be directed to
6 make necessary and appropriate arrangements in connec-
7 tion with the memorial observances in the Senate Cham-
8 ber.

9 *Resolved*, That the Secretary of the Senate commu-
10 nicate these resolutions to the House of Representatives,
11 transmit an enrolled copy thereof to the family of the de-
12 ceased, and invite the House of Representatives and the
13 family of the deceased to attend the memorial observances
14 in the Senate Chamber.

15 *Resolved*, That invitations be extended to the Presi-
16 dent of the United States, the Vice President of the
17 United States, and the members of the Cabinet, the Chief
18 Justice and Associate Justices of the Supreme Court of
19 the United States, the Diplomatic Corps (through the Sec-
20 retary of State), the Chief of Staff of the Army, the Chief
21 of Naval Operations of the Navy, the Major General Com-
22 mandant of the Marine Corps, the Chief of Staff of the
23 Air Force, and the Commandant of the Coast Guard to
24 attend the memorial observances in the Senate Chamber.

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
