Authorizing expenditures by the Senate Committee on Indian Affairs.

IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

Ms. CANTWELL, from the Committee on Indian Affairs, reported the following original resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Senate Committee on Indian Affairs.

1 *Resolved*, That, in carrying out its powers, duties, and
2 functions imposed by section 105 of S. Res. 4, agreed to
3 February 4, 1977 (95th Congress), and in exercising the
4 authority conferred on it by that section, the Committee
5 on Indian Affairs is authorized from October 1, 2013,
6 through September 30, 2014, and October 1, 2014,
7 through February 28, 2015, in its discretion (1) to make
8 expenditures from the contingent fund of the Senate, (2)
9 to employ personnel, and (3) with the prior consent of the
10 Government department or agency concerned and the

1 Committee on Rules and Administration, to use on a reim-
2 bursable, or non-reimbursable, basis the services of per-
3 sonnel of any such department or agency.

4 SEC. 2. (a) For the period October 1, 2013, through
5 September 30, 2014, expenses of the committee under this
6 resolution shall not exceed \$2,009,768.00, of which
7 amount (1) not to exceed \$20,000 may be expended for
8 the procurement of the services of individual consultants,
9 or organizations thereof (as authorized by section 202(i)
10 of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946, as amend-
11 ed), and (2) not to exceed \$20,000 may be expended for
12 the training of the professional staff of such committee
13 (under procedures specified by section 202(j) of the Legis-
14 lative Reorganization Act of 1946).

15 (b) For the period October 1, 2014, through Feb-
16 ruary 28, 2015, expenses of the committee under this res-
17 olution shall not exceed \$837,403.00, of which amount (1)
18 not to exceed \$20,000 may be expended for the procure-
19 ment of the services of individual consultants, or organiza-
20 tions thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legis-
21 lative Reorganization Act of 1946, as amended), and (2)
22 not to exceed \$20,000 may be expended for the training
23 of professional staff of such committee (under procedures
24 specified by section 202(j) of the Legislative Reorganiza-
25 tion Act of 1946).

1 SEC. 3. The committee shall report its findings, to-
2 gether with such recommendations for legislation as it
3 deems advisable, to the Senate at the earliest practicable
4 date, but not later than February 28, 2015.

5 SEC. 4. Expenses of the committee under this resolu-
6 tion shall be paid from the contingent fund of the Senate
7 upon vouchers approved by the Chairwoman of the com-
8 mittee, except that vouchers shall not be required (1) for
9 the disbursement of the salaries of employees paid at an
10 annual rate, or (2) for the payment of telecommunications
11 provided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Door-
12 keeper, United States Senate, or (3) for the payment of
13 stationery supplies purchased through the Keeper of the
14 Stationery, United States Senate, or (4) for payments to
15 the Postmaster, United States Senate, or (5) for the pay-
16 ment of metered charges on copying equipment provided
17 by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Doorkeeper,
18 United States Senate, or (6) for the payment of Senate
19 Recording and Photographic Services, or (7) for payment
20 of franked and mass mail costs by the Sergeant at Arms
21 and Doorkeeper, United States Senate.

22 SEC. 5. There are authorized such sums as may be
23 necessary for agency contributions related to the com-
24 pensation of employees of the committee from October 1,
25 2013, through September 30, 2014, and October 1, 2014,

1 through February 28, 2015, to be paid from the Appro-
2 priations account for Expenses of Inquiries and Investiga-
3 tions.
