Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on Environment and Public Works
of the Senate.

IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

Mrs. BOXER, from the Committee on Environment and Public Works, reported the following original resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on Environment
and Public Works of the Senate.

1 *Resolved,*

2 SECTION 1. In carrying out its powers, duties, and
3 functions under the Standing Rules of the Senate, in ac-
4 cordance with its jurisdiction under rule XXV of the
5 Standing Rules of the Senate, including holding hearings,
6 reporting such hearings, and making investigations as au-
7 thorized by paragraphs 1 and 8 of rule XXVI of the
8 Standing Rules of the Senate, the Committee on Environ-
9 ment and Public Works (in this resolution referred to as

1 the “committee”) is authorized from March 1, 2013,
2 through September 30, 2013, in its discretion—

3 (1) to make expenditures from the contingent
4 fund of the Senate;

5 (2) to employ personnel; and

6 (3) with the prior consent of the Government
7 department or agency concerned and the Committee
8 on Rules and Administration, to use on a reimburs-
9 able or nonreimbursable basis the services of per-
10 sonnel of any such department or agency.

11 SEC. 2. The expenses of the committee for the period
12 March 1, 2013, through September 30, 2013, under this
13 resolution shall not exceed \$3,178,904, of which amount—

14 (1) not to exceed \$4,666.67 may be expended
15 for the procurement of the services of individual con-
16 sultants, or organizations thereof (as authorized by
17 section 202(i) of the Legislative Reorganization Act
18 of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 72a(i))); and

19 (2) not to exceed \$1,166.67 may be expended
20 for the training of the professional staff of the com-
21 mittee (under procedures specified by section 202(j)
22 of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946).

23 SEC. 3. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), ex-
24 penses of the committee under this resolution shall be paid

1 from the contingent fund of the Senate upon vouchers ap-
2 proved by the chairman of the committee.

3 (b) Vouchers shall not be required—

4 (1) for the disbursement of salaries of employ-
5 ees paid at an annual rate;

6 (2) for the payment of telecommunications pro-
7 vided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and
8 Doorkeeper;

9 (3) for the payment of stationery supplies pur-
10 chased through the Keeper of the Stationery;

11 (4) for payments to the Postmaster of the Sen-
12 ate;

13 (5) for the payment of metered charges on
14 copying equipment provided by the Office of the Ser-
15 geant at Arms and Doorkeeper;

16 (6) for the payment of Senate Recording and
17 Photographic Services; or

18 (7) for payment of franked and mass mail costs
19 by the Sergeant at Arms and Doorkeeper, United
20 States Senate.

21 SEC. 4. There are authorized such sums as may be
22 necessary for agency contributions related to the com-
23 pensation of employees of the committee from March 1,
24 2013, through September 30, 2013, to be paid from the

- 1 appropriations account for “Expenses of Inquiries and In-
- 2 vestigations”.
