A BILL

To amend title XVIII of the Social Security Act to provide comprehensive audiology services to Medicare beneficiaries, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Medicare Audiology
5 Services Enhancement Act of 2015”.

1 **SEC. 2. COMPREHENSIVE AUDIOLOGY SERVICES FOR MEDI-**
2 **CARE BENEFICIARIES.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1861 of the Social Secu-
4 rity Act (42 U.S.C. 1395x) is amended—

5 (1) in subsection (s)(2)—

6 (A) in subparagraph (EE), by striking
7 “and” at the end;

8 (B) in subparagraph (FF), by adding
9 “and” at the end; and

10 (C) by adding at the end the following new
11 subparagraph:

12 “(GG) audiology services (as defined in
13 subsection (ll)(3));” and

14 (2) by amending paragraph (3) of subsection
15 (ll) to read as follows:

16 “(3) The term ‘audiology services’ means only the fol-
17 lowing services furnished by a qualified audiologist as the
18 audiologist is legally authorized to perform under State
19 law (or the State regulatory mechanism provided by State
20 law), pursuant to an order or referral by a physician, as
21 would otherwise be covered if furnished by a physician:

22 “(A) Hearing and balance assessment services.

23 “(B) Auditory treatment services, including au-
24 ditory processing and auditory rehabilitation treat-
25 ment.

26 “(C) Vestibular treatment services.

1 “(D) Intraoperative neurophysiologic moni-
2 toring services.”.

3 (b) PAYMENT UNDER PART B UNDER PHYSICIAN
4 FEE SCHEDULE FOR COMPREHENSIVE AUDIOLOGY SERV-
5 ICES.—Section 1848(j)(3) of the Social Security Act (42
6 U.S.C. 1395w-4(j)(3)) is amended by inserting
7 “(2)(GG),” before “(3),”.

8 (c) AUDIOLOGY SERVICES PERFORMED IN HOS-
9 PITALS EXCLUDED FROM INPATIENT HOSPITAL SERV-
10 ICES.—Section 1861(b)(4) of the Social Security Act (42
11 U.S.C. 1395x(b)(4)) is amended by striking “and services
12 of a certified registered nurse anesthetist” and inserting
13 “services of a certified registered nurse anesthetist, and
14 inter-operative neurophysiological monitoring provided by
15 a physician or qualified audiologist (as defined in sub-
16 section (ll)(4)(B))”.

17 (d) REQUIREMENTS OF SERVICE.—Section
18 1835(a)(2) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
19 1395n(a)(2)) is amended—

20 (1) in subparagraph (B), by striking “and (D)”
21 and inserting “(D), and (GG)”;

22 (2) by striking “and” at the end of subpara-
23 graph (E);

24 (3) by striking the period at the end of sub-
25 paragraph (F) and inserting “; and”; and

(4) by inserting after subparagraph (F) the following new subparagraph:

“(G) in the case of outpatient audiology services, (i) such services are or were required because the individual needed the specialized services of a physician or qualified audiologist to furnish such audiology services, (ii) a plan of care for furnishing such services has been established by the physician or qualified audiologist and is submitted to and periodically reviewed by the referring or ordering physician, and (iii) such services are or were furnished while the individual is or was under the care of a physician.”.

(e) AUDIOLOGY SERVICES INCLUDED AS DESIGNATED HEALTH SERVICES FOR PURPOSES OF LIMITATION ON CERTAIN PHYSICIAN REFERRALS.—Section 1877(h)(6) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1395nn(h)(6)) is amended by adding at the end the following new subparagraph:

“(M) Audiology services (as defined in section 1861(ll)(3)).”.

(f) PARTICIPATION IN MEDICARE.—Nothing in this section shall be construed to require a qualified audiologist (as defined in section 1861(ll)(4)(B) of the Social Security

1 Act (42 U.S.C. 1395x(ll)(4)(B))) to participate in the
2 Medicare program under title XVIII of the Social Security
3 Act (42 U.S.C. 1395 et seq.).

4 (g) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
5 this section shall apply to services furnished on or after
6 January 1, 2016.

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
