Mr. MOONEY of West Virginia introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce

A BILL

To amend the Communications Act of 1934 to exempt providers of broadband Internet access service from Federal universal service contributions.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Freedom from Internet
5 Tax Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. EXEMPTION OF BROADBAND PROVIDERS FROM**
7 **FEDERAL UNIVERSAL SERVICE CONTRIBU-**
8 **TIONS.**

9 Section 254(d) of the Communications Act of 1934
10 (47 U.S.C. 254(d)) is amended—

1 (1) by striking “Every” and inserting the fol-
2 lowing:

3 “(1) IN GENERAL.—Every”; and

4 (2) by adding at the end the following:

5 “(2) EXEMPTION FOR PROVIDERS OF
6 BROADBAND INTERNET ACCESS SERVICE.—This sub-
7 section does not apply to a person engaged in the
8 provision of broadband Internet access service (as
9 defined in the rules adopted in the Report and Order
10 on Remand, Declaratory Ruling, and Order that was
11 adopted by the Commission on February 26, 2015
12 (FCC 15–24)), insofar as such person is so en-
13 gaged.”.

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
