A BILL

To direct the Joint Committee on the Library to accept a statue depicting Pierre L'Enfant from the District of Columbia and to provide for the permanent display of the statue in the United States Capitol.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. FINDINGS.**

4 Congress finds the following:

5 (1) Pierre L'Enfant was born in France in
6 1754, and traveled to the United States to serve
7 with the United States in the Revolutionary War.

1 (2) Pierre L’Enfant was an engineer and archi-
2 tect, and in 1791 he developed the unique and ex-
3 ceptional design for the Nation’s capital that laid
4 the framework for the modern-day District of Co-
5 lumbia that is followed and maintained until today.

6 (3) L’Enfant’s remarkable design envisioned a
7 distinguishable federal and residential city with di-
8 agonal streets propelling from Congress and the
9 President’s home, beautiful boulevards on local
10 streets and neighborhoods, and open spaces for
11 monuments, memorials, and historical structures, all
12 of which largely remain intact, protected as a histor-
13 ical treasure.

14 (4) The United States Capitol does not cur-
15 rently appropriately recognize the contributions of
16 Pierre L’Enfant.

17 **SEC. 2. ACCEPTANCE OF STATUE OF PIERRE L’ENFANT FOR**
18 **PLACEMENT IN UNITED STATES CAPITOL.**

19 (a) ACCEPTANCE.—Not later than 2 years after the
20 date of the enactment of this Act, the Joint Committee
21 on the Library shall accept from the District of Columbia
22 the donation of a statue depicting Pierre L’Enfant, sub-
23 ject to the terms and conditions that the Joint Committee
24 considers appropriate.

1 (b) PLACEMENT.—The Joint Committee shall place
2 the statue accepted under subsection (a) in a suitable per-
3 manent location in the United States Capitol.
