Mr. GARRETT introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs, and in addition to the Committee on Armed Services, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

A BILL

To prohibit assistance to Iran to develop, use, or protect any technology or other assets of Iran's nuclear program, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the "Prohibiting Assistance
5 to Nuclear Iran Act".

1 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON ASSISTANCE TO IRAN TO DE-**
2 **VELOP, USE, OR PROTECT ANY TECHNOLOGY**
3 **OR OTHER ASSETS OF IRAN’S NUCLEAR PRO-**
4 **GRAM.**

5 (a) PROHIBITION.—No funds available to any Fed-
6 eral department or agency may be used to provide assist-
7 ance to Iran to develop, use, or protect any technology
8 or other assets of Iran’s nuclear program. For purposes
9 of this subsection, the term “assistance” shall be deemed
10 to include the use of the Armed Forces of the United
11 States.

12 (b) WAIVER.—The President may waive the prohibi-
13 tion on the use of funds to provide assistance to Iran
14 under subsection (a) on a case-by-case basis if—

15 (1) the President determines and submits to
16 Congress a certification that it is necessary to
17 United States national interests to do so; and

18 (2) not later than the end of the 5-day period
19 beginning on the date on which such certification is
20 submitted under paragraph (1), there is enacted a
21 joint resolution stating in substance that Congress
22 approves of such certification of the President.

23 (c) COMPUTATION OF PERIOD OF TIME.—The period
24 of time described in subsection (b)(2) shall be computed
25 without regard to—

1 (1) the days of which either House of Congress
2 is not in session because of an adjournment of more
3 than 3 days to a day certain or an adjournment of
4 the Congress sine die; and

5 (2) any Saturday and Sunday, not excluded
6 under paragraph (1), when either House of the Con-
7 gress is not in session.

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
