A BILL

To prohibit the provision of funds under title X of the Public Health Service Act to Planned Parenthood Federation of America, Inc., or its affiliates, subsidiaries, successors, or clinics during a period of review by the Government Accountability Office and the Congress.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Women’s Health Ac-
5 countability Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION OF PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICE ACT**
2 **TITLE X FUNDING TO PLANNED PARENT-**
3 **HOOD UNTIL CONGRESSIONAL REVIEW OF**
4 **GAO EVALUATION.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—No Federal funds may be made
6 available pursuant to a grant or contract under title X
7 of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 300 et seq.)
8 to Planned Parenthood Federation of America, Inc., or
9 any of its affiliates, subsidiaries, successors, or clinics
10 until the date on which Congress completes a review of
11 the report under subsection (b).

12 (b) CONGRESSIONAL REVIEW OF GAO EVALUATION
13 ON PLANNED PARENTHOOD ACTIVITIES.—

14 (1) GAO REPORT.—Not later than 2 years
15 after the date of enactment of this Act, the Comp-
16 troller General of the United States shall submit to
17 Congress a report containing an evaluation of all
18 medical items and services being offered in the facili-
19 ties of Planned Parenthood Federation of America,
20 Inc., and of its affiliates, subsidiaries, successors, or
21 clinics.

22 (2) CONGRESSIONAL REVIEW.—Not later than
23 the date that is three months after the date of re-
24 ceipt of the report under paragraph (1), Congress
25 shall complete a review of such report.
