To make persons who conspire to commit, commit, or benefit from an act of human trafficking ineligible for admission to the United States of America.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. GROUND OF INADMISSABILITY FOR TRAF-**
4 **FICKING.**

5 Section 212(a)(2)(H)(i) of the Immigration and Na-
6 tionality Act (8 U.S.C. 1182(a)(2)(H)(i)) is amended by
7 striking “who commits or conspires to commit human
8 trafficking offenses” and inserting “who commits or con-
9 spires to commit a human trafficking offense”.

1 **SEC. 2. PERMANENT EXCLUSION OF PERSONS WHO HAVE**
2 **BENEFITED FROM ILLICIT ACTIVITIES OF**
3 **TRAFFICKERS IN PERSONS.**

4 Section 212(a)(2)(H)(ii) of the Immigration and Na-
5 tionality Act (8 U.S.C. 1182(a)(2)(H)(ii)) is amended by
6 striking “has, within the previous 5 years, obtained any
7 financial or other benefit from the illicit activity” and in-
8 serting “has obtained any financial or other benefit from
9 the illicit activity”.

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
