Mr. SCHWEIKERT introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform

A BILL

To establish a pilot program to reduce the number of vehicles owned by certain Federal departments and increase the use of ride-sharing services.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PILOT PROGRAM FOR REDUCTION OF DEPART-**
4 **MENT-OWNED VEHICLES AND INCREASE IN**
5 **USE OF RIDE-SHARING SERVICES.**

6 (a) PILOT PROGRAM REQUIREMENT.—The Secretary
7 of each covered department shall establish a pilot program
8 within the department for the following purposes:

9 (1) To reduce the inventory of light vehicles
10 owned by the department by 10 percent for each of

1 the fiscal years described in subsection (b), through
2 the sale or other appropriate disposal of such vehi-
3 cles.

4 (2) At the discretion of the Secretary of the de-
5 partment, to increase the use by the department of
6 commercial ride-sharing companies.

7 (b) FISCAL YEARS DESCRIBED.—The fiscal years de-
8 scribed in this subsection are the following:

9 (1) The first fiscal year beginning after the ex-
10 piration of the 1-year period starting on the date of
11 the enactment of this Act.

12 (2) Each of the four fiscal years following the
13 fiscal year described in paragraph (1).

14 (c) REPORT TO CONGRESS.—Not later than 60 days
15 after the end of the fiscal year described in subsection
16 (b)(1), and annually thereafter for the duration of the
17 pilot program, the Secretary of each covered department
18 shall submit to Congress a report on the results of the
19 pilot program in the department. The report shall include
20 information about the transportation budget of the depart-
21 ment and such findings and recommendations as the Sec-
22 retary of the department considers appropriate.

23 (d) COVERED DEPARTMENT.—In this Act, the term
24 “covered department” means each of the following:

25 (1) The Department of Agriculture.

- 1 (2) The Department of the Interior.
- 2 (3) The Department of Energy.

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
