Mr. COOPER introduced the following bill; which was referred to the

A BILL

To provide that Members of Congress shall be paid last whenever the Treasury is unable to satisfy the obligations of the United States Government in a timely manner because the public debt limit has been reached.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Stop Pay for Members
5 Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. MEMBERS OF CONGRESS TO BE PAID LAST.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—In the event that the public debt
8 of the United States Government reaches the public debt

1 limit, the obligation to pay basic pay of Members of Con-
2 gress may not be satisfied until—

3 (1) all other obligations of the United States
4 Government which are then due have been satisfied;
5 or

6 (2) if earlier, the ability of the Treasury to sat-
7 isfy the obligations of the United States Government
8 in timely manner is restored, whether by an increase
9 in the public debt limit or otherwise.

10 (b) CONSENT.—Each Member of Congress consents
11 and agrees that payment of basic pay in accordance with
12 subsection (a) shall constitute a full and complete dis-
13 charge and acquittance of all claims and demands for serv-
14 ice as such a Member during the period covered by the
15 payment.

16 **SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.**

17 For purposes of this Act—

18 (1) the term “public debt limit” means the dol-
19 lar limitation contained in section 3101(b) of title
20 31, United States Code; and

21 (2) the term “Member of Congress” means
22 each individual whose annual rate of pay is deter-
23 mined under section 601(a) of the Legislative Reor-
24 ganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 4501).

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
