Ms. BORDALLO introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on Natural Resources

A BILL

To provide reforms through the Organic Act of Guam.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PROHIBITION ON SALARY CHANGES FOR THE**
4 **GOVERNOR, LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR, AND**
5 **SENATOR OF THE GUAM LEGISLATURE.**

6 Section 6 of the Organic Act of Guam (48 U.S.C.
7 1422) is amended by adding at the end the following:

8 “No law varying the compensation for the services
9 of the Governor of Guam, the Lieutenant Governor of
10 Guam, or Senators in the Guam Legislature shall take ef-
11 fect until a General Election of the Guam Legislature shall
12 have intervened.”.

1 **SEC. 2. RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT.**

2 Section 6 of the Organic Act of Guam (48 U.S.C.
3 1422) is amended by striking “unless he is an eligible
4 voter and has been for five consecutive years immediately
5 preceding the election a citizen of the United States and
6 a bona fide resident of Guam” and inserting “unless that
7 person is an eligible voter, a citizen of the United States,
8 and a resident of Guam, as specified by the laws of
9 Guam”.

10 **SEC. 3. QUALIFICATIONS OF MEMBERS.**

11 Section 16 of the Organic Act of Guam (48 U.S.C.
12 1423f) is amended by striking “domiciled in Guam for at
13 least five years” and inserting “a resident of Guam, as
14 specified by the laws of Guam,”.

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
