## A BILL

To suspend foreign assistance to certain countries related to unlawful migration.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Illegal Entry Account-  
5 ability Act of 2015”.

6 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

7 Congress finds the following:

8 (1) The border between the United States and  
9 Mexico is not secure on either side, thereby allowing

1 hundreds of thousands of individuals annually to  
2 enter the United States illegally.

3 (2) The majority of the individuals illegally  
4 crossing the United States-Mexico border are from  
5 Mexico, Honduras, Guatemala, and El Salvador.

6 (3) Today, tens of thousands of unaccompanied  
7 alien children are crossing the United States-Mexico  
8 border sparking a humanitarian crisis and endan-  
9 gering thousands of children.

10 (4) The Department of Homeland Security is  
11 spending millions of Americans' tax dollars to proc-  
12 ess and provide housing and healthcare services to  
13 unaccompanied alien children.

14 (5) The countries previously listed have failed  
15 to secure their borders and have failed to adopt and  
16 enforce policies that discourage illegal immigration  
17 into the United States.

18 **SEC. 3. SUSPENSION OF FOREIGN ASSISTANCE.**

19 (a) IN GENERAL.—Upon enactment of this Act, the  
20 Secretary of State shall immediately suspend all United  
21 States foreign assistance to the countries of Mexico, Hon-  
22 duras, Guatemala, and El Salvador. Such assistance may  
23 be reinstated only if Congress determines that Mexico,  
24 Honduras, Guatemala, and El Salvador have taken suffi-

1 cient action to mitigate unlawful United States-Mexico  
2 border crossings by their respective citizens.

3 (b) REPORT.—The Secretary of State shall annually  
4 submit to Congress a report documenting the measures  
5 taken by Mexico, Honduras, Guatemala and El Salvador  
6 to mitigate unlawful entry into the United States by its  
7 citizens.

8 (c) EXCEPTION.—Foreign assistance distributed  
9 under the International Narcotic Control Law Enforce-  
10 ment program shall not be considered under subsection  
11 (a).
