A BILL

To amend title XIX of the Social Security Act to provide parity among States in the timing of the application of higher Federal Medicaid matching rates for the ACA-expansion population.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Medicaid Expansion
5 Parity Act of 2016”.

1 **SEC. 2. PARITY IN THE TIMING OF THE APPLICATION OF**
2 **HIGHER MEDICAID FEDERAL MATCHING**
3 **RATES FOR ACA NEWLY ELIGIBLE INDIVID-**
4 **UALS.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1905(y)(1) of the Social
6 Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1396d(y)(1)) is amended—

7 (1) in subparagraph (A), by striking “for cal-
8 endar quarters in 2014, 2015, and 2016” and in-
9 serting “for calendar quarters in the 12-calendar-
10 quarter period beginning with the first calendar
11 quarter in which the State provides medical assist-
12 ance to newly eligible individuals”;

13 (2) in subparagraph (B), by striking “for cal-
14 endar quarters in 2017” and inserting “for the next
15 4 calendar quarters for such State”;

16 (3) in subparagraph (C), by striking “for cal-
17 endar quarters in 2018” and inserting “for the next
18 4 calendar quarters for such State”;

19 (4) in subparagraph (D), by striking “for cal-
20 endar quarters in 2019” and inserting “for the next
21 4 calendar quarters for such State”; and

22 (5) in subparagraph (E), by striking “for cal-
23 endar quarters in 2020 and each year thereafter”
24 and inserting “for each succeeding calendar quarter
25 for such State”.

1 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
2 subsection (a) shall take effect as if included in the enact-
3 ment of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act.

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
