Ms. DUCKWORTH introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

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## A BILL

To provide adequate resources for the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the VALOR Officer Safety Initiative.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Counterterrorism En-  
5 hancement Act of 2016”.

6 **SEC. 2. DOMESTIC TERROR PREVENTION.**

7 (a) FBI FUNDING.—For fiscal year 2017, an addi-  
8 tional \$175,000,000 are authorized to be appropriated to  
9 the Attorney General for personnel, training, and equip-  
10 ment by the Federal Bureau of Investigation needed to

1 counter both terrorism, including domestic and foreign  
2 threats.

3 (b) VALOR INITIATIVE.—For fiscal year 2017, an  
4 additional \$15,000,000 are authorized to be appropriated  
5 to the Attorney General for an Officer Robert Wilson III  
6 memorial initiative to be administered by the Bureau of  
7 Justice Programs on Preventing Violence Against Law  
8 Enforcement Officer Resilience and Survivability  
9 (VALOR).

10 (c) CIVIL RIGHTS DIVISION.—For fiscal year 2017,  
11 an additional \$30,000,000 are authorized to be appro-  
12 priated to the Attorney General for the Civil Rights Divi-  
13 sion of the Department of Justice.

14 (d) COMMUNITY RELATIONS SERVICE.—For fiscal  
15 year 2017, an additional \$11,000,000 are authorized to  
16 be appropriated to the Attorney General for personnel and  
17 training to respond to hate crimes by the Community Re-  
18 lations Service of the Department of Justice.

19 (e) FIREARMS TRAFFICKING.—Section 924 of title  
20 18, United States Code, is amended by striking subsection  
21 (h) and inserting the following:

22 “(h) Whoever knowingly transfers or receives a fire-  
23 arm, knowing or having reasonable cause to believe that  
24 such firearm will be used to commit a Federal crime of  
25 terrorism (as defined in section 2332b(g)(5)), a crime of

1 violence (as defined in subsection (c)(3)), or a drug traf-  
2 ficking crime (as defined in subsection (c)(2)) shall be im-  
3 prisoned not more than 15 years, fined in accordance with  
4 this title, or both.”.

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
