A BILL

To require the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency to include in each regulatory impact analysis for a proposed or final rule an analysis that does not include any other proposed or unimplemented rule.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Real EPA Impact Re-
5 views Act” or the “REPAIR Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. REGULATORY IMPACT ANALYSIS REQUIREMENT.**

2 Notwithstanding any other provision of law (includ-
3 ing regulations), including Executive Order 13563 (76
4 Fed. Reg. 3821 (January 21, 2011)), Executive Order
5 12866 (58 Fed. Reg. 51735 (October 4, 1993)), and the
6 document of the Office of Management and Budget enti-
7 tled “OMB Circular A–4”, in promulgating any rule the
8 cost of which is projected to be greater than \$1,000,000,
9 the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agen-
10 cy shall include in each of the regulatory impact analyses
11 for the proposed and final rule at least 1 analysis that
12 does not include—

13 (1) any other proposed rule; or

14 (2) any other rule that, as of the date of the
15 analysis—

16 (A) has been finalized by the Adminis-
17 trator; but

18 (B) has not been implemented.

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
