A BILL

To amend title 38, United States Code, to increase the maximum age for children eligible for medical care under the CHAMPVA program, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “CHAMPVA Children’s
5 Care Protection Act of 2015”.

1 **SEC. 2. INCREASE OF MAXIMUM AGE FOR CHILDREN ELIGI-**
 2 **BLE FOR MEDICAL CARE UNDER CHAMPVA**
 3 **PROGRAM.**

4 (a) INCREASE.—Subsection (c) of section 1781 of
 5 title 38, United States Code, is amended to read as fol-
 6 lows:

7 “(c)(1) Notwithstanding clauses (i) and (iii) of sec-
 8 tion 101(4)(A) of this title and except as provided in para-
 9 graph (2), for purposes of this section, a child who is eligi-
 10 ble for benefits under subsection (a) shall remain eligible
 11 for benefits under this section until the child’s 26th birth-
 12 day, regardless of the child’s marital status.

13 “(2) Before January 1, 2016, paragraph (1) shall not
 14 apply to a child who is eligible to enroll in an eligible em-
 15 ployer-sponsored plan (as defined in section 5000A(f)(2)
 16 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986).

17 “(3) This subsection shall not be construed to limit
 18 eligibility for benefits under subsection (a) of a child de-
 19 scribed in section 101(4)(A)(ii) of this title.”.

20 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—Such subsection, as so
 21 amended, shall apply with respect to medical care provided
 22 on or after the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
