A BILL

To amend title 46, United States Code, to exempt old vessels that only operate within inland waterways from the fire-retardant materials requirement if the owners of such vessels make annual structural alterations to at least 10 percent of the areas of the vessels that are not constructed of fire-retardant materials.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
 2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. FIRE-RETARDANT MATERIALS EXEMPTION.**

4 Section 3503 of title 46, United States Code, is
 5 amended—

6 (1) in subsection (a), by striking “2008, this
 7 section” and inserting “2028, this subsection”; and

8 (2) in subsection (b)(1)—

9 (A) in the matter preceding subparagraph
 10 (A), by striking “this section” and inserting
 11 “subsection (a)”;

12 (B) in subparagraph (A), by inserting
 13 “and crew” after “prospective passengers”;

14 (C) in subparagraph (B), by inserting “or
 15 crew member” after “passenger”;

16 (D) in subparagraph (C), by striking
 17 “and” at the end; and

18 (E) by striking subparagraph (D) and in-
 19 serting the following:

20 “(D) the owner or managing operator of
 21 the vessel shall—

22 “(i) make annual structural alter-
 23 ations to not less than 10 percent of the
 24 areas of the vessel that are not constructed
 25 of fire-retardant materials;

1 “(ii) provide advance notice to the
2 Coast Guard regarding the alterations
3 made pursuant to clause (i); and

4 “(iii) comply with any noncombustible
5 material requirements prescribed by the
6 Coast Guard; and

7 “(E) the requirements referred to in sub-
8 paragraph (D)(iii) shall, to the extent prac-
9 ticable, be consistent with the preservation of
10 the historic integrity of the vessel in areas car-
11 rying or accessible to passengers or generally
12 visible to the public.”.
