A BILL

To provide for the management of certain inventoried
roadless areas, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Inventoried Roadless
5 Area Management Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. MANAGEMENT OF INVENTORIED ROADLESS AREAS.**

7 (a) FINDING.—Congress finds that, for purposes of
8 the second roadless area review and evaluation program
9 (RARE II) and the land and resource management plan
10 revision process under section 6 of the Forest and Range-

1 land Renewable Resources Planning Act of 1974 (16
2 U.S.C. 1604), the National Forest System land described
3 in subsection (c) has been adequately studied for wilder-
4 ness designation and should not be recommended as po-
5 tential additions to the National Wilderness Preservation
6 System.

7 (b) RELEASE.—The National Forest System land de-
8 scribed in subsection (c)—

9 (1) is no longer subject to the land use restric-
10 tions of the Roadless Area Conservation Rule estab-
11 lished under part 294 of title 36, Code of Federal
12 Regulations (or successor regulations); and

13 (2) shall not be managed to preserve roadless
14 or wilderness characteristics.

15 (c) DESCRIPTION OF LAND.—The National Forest
16 System land referred to in subsections (a) and (b) is each
17 of the inventoried roadless areas within the National For-
18 est System in the State of Wyoming, as set forth in the
19 maps contained in the Forest Service Roadless Area Con-
20 servation, Final Environmental Impact Statement, Vol-
21 ume 2, dated November 2000.

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
