Mr. SCHUMER introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

For the relief of Alemseghed Mussie Tesfamical.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENT STATUS FOR**
4 **ALEMSEGHED MUSSIE TEFAMICAL.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding subsections (a)
6 and (b) of section 201 of the Immigration and Nationality
7 Act (8 U.S.C. 1151) and section 240 of such Act (8
8 U.S.C. 1229a), Alemseghed Mussie Tesfamical shall be el-
9 igible for the issuance of an immigrant visa or for adjust-
10 ment of status to that of an alien lawfully admitted for
11 permanent residence upon filing an application for
12 issuance of an immigrant visa under section 204 of such

1 Act (8 U.S.C. 1154) or for adjustment of status to lawful
2 permanent resident.

3 (b) ADJUSTMENT OF STATUS.—If Alemseghed
4 Mussie Tesfamical enters the United States before the fil-
5 ing deadline specified in subsection (c), Alemseghed
6 Mussie Tesfamical shall be considered to have entered into
7 and remained lawfully in the United States and, if other-
8 wise eligible, shall be eligible for adjustment of status
9 under section 245 of the Immigration and Nationality Act
10 (8 U.S.C. 1255) as of the date of the enactment of this
11 Act.

12 (c) DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION AND PAYMENT OF
13 FEES.—Subsections (a) and (b) shall apply only if the ap-
14 plication for issuance of an immigrant visa or the applica-
15 tion for adjustment of status is filed with appropriate fees
16 not later than 2 years after the date of the enactment of
17 this Act.

18 (d) REDUCTION OF IMMIGRANT VISA NUMBER.—
19 Upon the granting of an immigrant visa or permanent res-
20 idence to Alemseghed Mussie Tesfamical, the Secretary of
21 State shall instruct the proper officer to reduce by 1, dur-
22 ing the current or next following fiscal year, the total num-
23 ber of immigrant visas that are made available to natives
24 of the country of Alemseghed Mussie Tesfamical's birth
25 under section 203(a) of the Immigration and Nationality

1 Act (8 U.S.C. 1153(a)) or, if applicable, the total number
2 of immigrant visas that are made available to natives of
3 the country of Alemseghed Mussie Tesfamical's birth
4 under section 202(e) of such Act (8 U.S.C. 1152(e)).

5 (e) BUDGETARY EFFECTS.—The budgetary effects of
6 this Act, for the purpose of complying with the Statutory
7 Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010 (Public Law 111–139), shall
8 be determined by reference to the latest statement titled
9 “Budgetary Effects of PAYGO Legislation” for this Act,
10 submitted for printing in the Congressional Record by the
11 Chairman of the Committee on the Budget of the Senate,
12 provided that such statement has been submitted prior to
13 the vote on passage.

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
