A BILL

To amend title 10, United States Code, to ensure criminal background checks of employees of the military child care system and providers of child care services and youth program services for military dependents.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Military Child Care
5 Protection Act of 2016”.

1 **SEC. 2. CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECKS OF EMPLOYEES**
2 **OF THE MILITARY CHILD CARE SYSTEM AND**
3 **PROVIDERS OF CHILD CARE SERVICES AND**
4 **YOUTH PROGRAM SERVICES FOR MILITARY**
5 **DEPENDENTS.**

6 (a) EMPLOYEES OF MILITARY CHILD CARE SYS-
7 TEM.—Section 1792 of title 10, United States Code, is
8 amended—

9 (1) by redesignating subsection (d) as sub-
10 section (e); and

11 (2) by inserting after subsection (c) the fol-
12 lowing new subsection (d):

13 “(d) CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK.—The criminal
14 background check of child care employees under this sec-
15 tion that is required pursuant to section 231 of the Crime
16 Control Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 13041) shall be conducted
17 pursuant to regulations prescribed by the Secretary of De-
18 fense in accordance with the provisions of section 658H
19 of the Child Care and Development Block Grant Act of
20 1990 (42 U.S.C. 9858f).”.

21 (b) PROVIDERS OF CHILD CARE SERVICES AND
22 YOUTH PROGRAM SERVICES.—Section 1798 of such title
23 is amended—

24 (1) by redesignating subsection (c) as sub-
25 section (d); and

1 (2) by inserting after subsection (b) the fol-
2 lowing new subsection (c):

3 “(c) CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK.—A provider of
4 child care services or youth program services may not pro-
5 vide such services under this section unless such provider
6 complies with the requirements for criminal background
7 checks under section 658H of the Child Care and Develop-
8 ment Block Grant Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 9858f) for the
9 State in which such services are provided.”.

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
