A BILL

To amend title 5, United States Code, to expand law enforcement availability pay to employees of the Air and Marine Operations of U.S. Customs and Border Protection.

1 **SECTION 1. LAW ENFORCEMENT AVAILABILITY PAY FOR**
2 **EMPLOYEES OF THE AIR AND MARINE OPER-**
3 **ATIONS OF U.S. CUSTOMS AND BORDER PRO-**
4 **TECTION.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 5545a(i) of title 5, United
6 States Code, is amended—

7 (1) by striking “apply to a pilot employed by
8 the United States Customs Service” and inserting
9 “apply to any employee of the Air and Marine Oper-
10 ations of U.S. Customs and Border Protection, or
11 any successor thereto,”; and

12 (2) by striking “such pilot” and inserting “such
13 employee”.

14 (b) APPLICABILITY.—The amendments made by sub-
15 section (a) shall take effect on the first day of the first
16 applicable pay period beginning on or after the date that
17 is 14 days after the date of enactment of this Act.

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
