Mr. GRAHAM (for himself, Ms. AYOTTE, Mr. KIRK, Mr. BLUNT, Mr. RUBIO,
Mr. CRUZ, and Mr. MCCAIN) introduced the following bill; which was
read twice and referred to the Committee on Appropriations

A BILL

Making emergency supplemental appropriations for the fiscal
year ending September 30, 2016, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That the following sums are appropriated, out of any
4 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the
5 fiscal year ending September 30, 2016, and for other pur-
6 poses, namely:

2 ASSISTANCE FOR ISRAEL
3 CHAPTER 1—DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE
4 PROCUREMENT
5 PROCUREMENT, DEFENSE-WIDE

6 For an additional amount for “Procurement, De-
7 fense-Wide”, \$700,000,000, to remain available until Sep-
8 tember 30, 2018, which shall be for the Secretary of De-
9 fense to provide to the Government of Israel for the pro-
10 curement of missile defense systems to address security
11 threats from Iran, subject to previously established trans-
12 fer procedures and in accordance with United States–
13 Israeli production agreements: *Provided*, That such
14 amount is designated by the Congress as an emergency
15 requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the
16 Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of
17 1985.

18 RESEARCH, DEVELOPMENT, TEST AND
19 EVALUATION
20 RESEARCH, DEVELOPMENT, TEST AND EVALUATION,
21 DEFENSE-WIDE

22 For an additional amount for “Research, Develop-
23 ment, Test and Evaluation, Defense-Wide”, \$50,000,000,
24 to remain available until September 30, 2017, which shall
25 be for the Secretary of Defense to provide to the Govern-

1 ment of Israel for the procurement of missile defense sys-
 2 tems to address security threats from Iran, subject to pre-
 3 viously established transfer procedures and in accordance
 4 with United States–Israeli production agreements: *Pro-*
 5 *vided*, That such amount is designated by the Congress
 6 as an emergency requirement pursuant to section
 7 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
 8 Deficit Control Act of 1985.

9 CHAPTER 2—FOREIGN MILITARY FINANCING
 10 PROGRAM

11 INTERNATIONAL SECURITY ASSISTANCE
 12 FUNDS APPROPRIATED TO THE PRESIDENT

13 FOREIGN MILITARY FINANCING PROGRAM

14 For an additional amount for “Foreign Military Fi-
 15 nancing Program”, \$750,000,000, to remain available
 16 until September 30, 2017, for assistance for Israel to ad-
 17 dress security threats from Iran, which shall be disbursed
 18 within 30 days of enactment of this Act: *Provided*, That
 19 such amount is designated by the Congress as an emer-
 20 gency requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of
 21 the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act
 22 of 1985.

SEC. 101. Each amount designated in this Act by the Congress as an emergency requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 shall be available only if the President subsequently so designates all such amounts and transmits such designations to the Congress.

9 TITLE II

10 IRAN SANCTIONS ACT REAUTHORIZATION

Section 13(b) of the Iran Sanctions Act of 1996 (Public Law 104–172; 50 U.S.C. 1701 note) is amended by striking “December 31, 2016” and inserting “December 31, 2031”.

15 This Act may be cited as the “Emergency Supple-
16 mental Appropriations Act for the Defense of Israel,
17 2016”.
