A BILL

To prohibit the provision of certain foreign assistance to countries receiving certain detainees transferred from United States Naval Station, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Guantanamo Bay Re-
5 civism Prevention Act of 2015”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON CERTAIN FOREIGN ASSISTANCE**
2 **FOR COUNTRIES RECEIVING CERTAIN DE-**
3 **TAINÉES TRANSFERRED FROM UNITED**
4 **STATES NAVAL STATION, GUANTANAMO BAY,**
5 **CUBA.**

6 (a) PROHIBITION.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
7 sion of law, assistance may not be provided under any Act
8 specified in subsection (b) to a foreign country if—

9 (1) the country received an individual who was
10 released or transferred from United States Naval
11 Station, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, on or after Feb-
12 ruary 1, 2015; and

13 (2) after the date of such release or transfer,
14 the individual is included in a report under section
15 319 of the Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2009
16 (Public Law 111–32; 123 Stat. 1874; 10 U.S.C. 801
17 note) as described by subsection (c)(4) of that sec-
18 tion.

19 (b) COVERED ACTS.—The Acts specified in this sub-
20 section are the following:

21 (1) The Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22
22 U.S.C. 2151 et seq.).

23 (2) The Arms Export Control Act (22 U.S.C.
24 2751 et seq.).

25 (c) COMMENCEMENT OF APPLICABILITY OF PROHIBI-
26 TION.—The prohibition in subsection (a) shall commence

1 applying to a foreign country on the date of the first re-
2 port described in subsection (a)(2) that includes any indi-
3 vidual described in subsection (a)(1) who was received by
4 the country on or after February 1, 2015.

5 (d) DURATION OF APPLICABILITY OF PROHIBI-
6 TION.—The prohibition in subsection (a) shall cease with
7 respect to a foreign country on the date that is five years
8 after the date of the commencement of the applicability
9 of the prohibition to the country under subsection (c).

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
