RESOLUTION

To authorize deposition testimony and representation in *Care One Management LLC, et al. v. United Healthcare Workers East, SEIU 1199, et al.*

Whereas, in the case of *Care One Management LLC, et al. v. United Healthcare Workers East, SEIU 1199, et al.*, No. 2:12-cv-06371, pending in the United States District Court for the District of New Jersey, testimony has been sought from Rachel Pryor, a former employee in the office of Senator Richard Blumenthal, relating to her official responsibilities;

Whereas, pursuant to sections 703(a) and 704(a)(2) of the Ethics in Government Act of 1978, 2 U.S.C. §§ 288b(a) and 288c(a)(2), the Senate may direct its counsel to represent former employees of the Senate with respect to

any subpoena, order, or request for testimony relating to their official responsibilities;

Whereas, by the privileges of the Senate of the United States and Rule XI of the Standing Rules of the Senate, no evidence under the control or in the possession of the Senate may, by the judicial or administrative process, be taken from such control or possession but by permission of the Senate; and

Whereas, when it appears that evidence under the control or in the possession of the Senate may promote the administration of justice, the Senate will take such action as will promote the ends of justice consistent with the privileges of the Senate: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That Rachel Pryor, former employee in the
 2 Office of Senator Richard Blumenthal, is authorized to
 3 testify in a deposition in the case of *Care One Management*
 4 *LLC, et al. v. United Healthcare Workers East, SEIU 1199,*
 5 *et al.*, except concerning matters for which a privilege
 6 should be asserted.

7 SEC. 2. The Senate Legal Counsel is authorized to
 8 represent Ms. Pryor in connection with the testimony au-
 9 thorized in section one of this resolution.
