A BILL

To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to increase the amount that can be withdrawn without penalty from individual retirement plans as first-time homebuyer distributions.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “First Time Home-
5 owner Savings Plan Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. INCREASE IN LIMITATION ON PENALTY-FREE**
2 **FIRST-TIME HOMEBUYER DISTRIBUTIONS.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 72(t)(8)(B)(i) of the In-
4 ternal Revenue Code of 1986 is amended by striking
5 “\$10,000” and inserting “\$25,000”.

6 (b) INFLATION ADJUSTMENT.—Section 72(t)(8) of
7 such Code is amended by adding at the end the following
8 new subparagraph:

9 “(F) INFLATION ADJUSTMENT.—In the
10 case of any taxable year beginning in a calendar
11 year after 2018, the \$25,000 amount in sub-
12 paragraph (B)(i) shall be increased by an
13 amount equal to—

14 “(i) such dollar amount, multiplied by

15 “(ii) the cost-of-living adjustment de-
16 termined under section 1(f)(3) for the cal-
17 endar year in which the taxable year be-
18 gins, by substituting ‘calendar year 2017’
19 for ‘calendar year 1992’.

20 Any increase determined under the preceding
21 sentence shall be rounded to the nearest mul-
22 tiple of \$100.”.

23 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
24 this section shall apply to distributions made December
25 31, 2017, in taxable years ending after such date.
