Ms. ROS-LEHTINEN (for herself, Mr. SERRANO, Mr. CURBELO of Florida, Ms. MICHELLE LUJAN GRISHAM of New Mexico, Mr. CÁRDENAS, Mrs. TORRES, Mr. HURD, Mr. KING of New York, and Mr. NEWHOUSE) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on House Administration, and in addition to the Committees on Natural Resources, and Transportation and Infrastructure, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

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# A BILL

To establish within the Smithsonian Institution the National Museum of the American Latino, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-  
2       tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

**3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “National Museum of  
5       the American Latino Act”.

**6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

7       Congress finds the following:

1                         (1) The United States is a symbol of democ-  
2 racy, freedom, and economic opportunity around the  
3 world, and the legacy of Latinos is deeply rooted in  
4 the very fabric of the history, democracy, freedom,  
5 and economic opportunity of the United States.

6                         (2) There exists no national museum within the  
7 Smithsonian Institution that is devoted to the docu-  
8 mentation and explication of Latino life, art, history,  
9 and culture.

10                        (3) The establishment of the National Museum  
11 of the American Latino will be consistent with the  
12 purposes of the Smithsonian Institution, created by  
13 Congress in 1846, “for the increase and diffusion of  
14 knowledge”.

15                        (4) The National Museum of the American  
16 Latino—

17                        (A) will be the keystone for people in the  
18 United States and other Smithsonian Institu-  
19 tion visitors to learn about Latino contributions  
20 to life, art, history, and culture in the United  
21 States at its signature location on the National  
22 Mall; and

23                        (B) will serve as a gateway for visitors to  
24 view other Latino exhibitions, collections, and  
25 programming at other Smithsonian Institution

1           facilities and museums throughout the United  
2           States and the territories of the United States.

3           (5) The National Museum of the American  
4           Latino will be unique among the museums of the  
5           Smithsonian Institution in that a significant number  
6           of the museum's staff will have joint positions  
7           throughout the various other museums and research  
8           centers of the Smithsonian Institution—

9                 (A) resulting in a decreased need for re-  
10                sources for the National Museum of the Amer-  
11                ican Latino on the National Mall; and

12                 (B) contributing to an integrated approach  
13                in telling the story of the United States in ex-  
14                hibits and collections throughout the Smithso-  
15                nian Institution.

16           (6) By sharing resources (including funding  
17           and staff) that are provided by direct appropriation  
18           to the National Museum of the American Latino and  
19           resources that are provided to other units of the  
20           Smithsonian Institution, the National Museum of  
21           the American Latino will serve as a key agent in  
22           stimulating and increasing Smithsonian Institution  
23           activities dedicated to the collection, preservation, re-  
24           search, and exhibition of Latino historical and cul-  
25           tural material reflecting the breadth and depth of

1       the experiences of Latino history and culture  
2       throughout the Smithsonian Institution.

3 **SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.**

4       In this Act:

5              (1) **BOARD OF REGENTS.**—The term “Board of  
6       Regents” means the Board of Regents of the Smith-  
7       sonian Institution.

8              (2) **BOARD OF TRUSTEES.**—The term “Board  
9       of Trustees” means the Board of Trustees of the  
10       National Museum of the American Latino as estab-  
11       lished by section 5.

12             (3) **DIRECTOR.**—The term “Director” means  
13       the Director of the National Museum of the Amer-  
14       ican Latino.

15             (4) **MUSEUM.**—The term “Museum” means the  
16       National Museum of the American Latino estab-  
17       lished by section 4.

18             (5) **SECRETARY.**—The term “Secretary” means  
19       the Secretary of the Smithsonian Institution.

20 **SEC. 4. ESTABLISHMENT OF MUSEUM.**

21             (a) **ESTABLISHMENT.**—There is established within  
22       the Smithsonian Institution a museum to be known as the  
23       “National Museum of the American Latino”.

24             (b) **PURPOSES.**—The purposes of the Museum are—

1                             (1) to illuminate the story of the United States  
2                             for the benefit of all by featuring Latino contribu-  
3                             tions; and

4                             (2) to provide for—

5                                 (A) the collection, study, research, publica-  
6                             tion, and establishment of exhibitions and pro-  
7                             grams relating to Latino life, art, history, and  
8                             culture that encompass—

9                                 (i) Latino contributions to the early  
10                             history of what now encompasses the  
11                             United States of America and its terri-  
12                             tories;

13                                 (ii) Latino contributions in the armed  
14                             services from the earliest days of the  
15                             American Revolution to current military  
16                             activities in defense of our freedoms;

17                                 (iii) Latino contributions to the free-  
18                             dom, well-being, and economic prosperity  
19                             of all people in the United States through  
20                             historical movements;

21                                 (iv) entrepreneurial and charitable ac-  
22                             tivities of Latinos; and

23                                 (v) contributions by Latinos to—

24                                 (I) the social, natural, and phys-  
25                             ical sciences; and

## 16 SEC. 5. BOARD OF TRUSTEES.

17       (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established within  
18 the Smithsonian Institution a Board of Trustees of the  
19 Museum with the duties, powers, and authority specified  
20 in this section.

21 (b) DUTIES.—

**22** (1) IN GENERAL.—The Board of Trustees—

23 (A) shall—

(B) may delegate the duties described in clauses (i) through (iv) of subparagraph (A) to the Director.

(A) purchase, accept, borrow, or otherwise acquire artifacts and other objects for addition to the collections of the Museum;

(B) loan, exchange, sell, or otherwise dispose of any part of the collections of the Museum, with the proceeds of such transactions to be used for additions to the collections of the Museum; and

(C) specify criteria with respect to the use of the collections and resources of the Museum, including policies on programming, education, exhibitions, and research with respect to—

(i) the life, art, history, culture, and other aspects of Latinos in the United States and the territories of the United States;

(ii) the role of Latinos in the history of the United States from the arrival of the first explorers to the Americas to the present;

(iii) the contributions of Latinos to society and culture in the United States, and exploring what it means to be an American; and

(iv) sharing how values in the United States such as resiliency, optimism, and spirituality are reflected in Latino history and culture.

1                             (3) OTHER RESPONSIBILITIES.—Subject to the  
2 general policies of the Board of Regents, the Board  
3 of Trustees shall have authority to—

4                             (A) provide for preservation, restoration,  
5 and maintenance of the collections of the Mu-  
6 seum; and

7                             (B) solicit, accept, use, and dispose of  
8 gifts, bequests, and devises of personal and real  
9 property for the purpose of aiding and facili-  
10 tating the work of the Museum.

11                             (c) COMPOSITION AND APPOINTMENT.—

12                             (1) IN GENERAL.—The Board of Trustees shall  
13 be composed of not more than 19 voting members  
14 as provided under paragraph (2).

15                             (2) VOTING MEMBERS.—The Board of Trustees  
16 shall include the following voting members:

17                             (A) The Secretary of the Smithsonian In-  
18 stitution.

19                             (B) The Under Secretary of Museums and  
20 Research of the Smithsonian Institution.

21                             (C) One member of the Board of Regents,  
22 appointed by the Board of Regents.

23                             (D) Two Members of Congress, one from  
24 each political party, designated by the Congres-

1           sional Hispanic Caucus and the Congressional  
2           Hispanic Conference.

3           (E) Fourteen individuals who shall be ap-  
4           pointed by the Board of Regents after taking  
5           into consideration—

6                 (i) efforts to have a politically and  
7                 geographically diverse representation on  
8                 the Board of Trustees reflecting States  
9                 and territories with significant Latino pop-  
10                 ulations;

11                 (ii) individuals recommended by mem-  
12                 bers of the Board of Trustees; and

13                 (iii) individuals recommended by orga-  
14                 nizations and entities that are committed  
15                 to the advancement of knowledge of Latino  
16                 life, art, history, and culture.

17           (3) INITIAL APPOINTMENTS.—The Board of  
18           Regents shall make initial appointments to the  
19           Board of Trustees under paragraph (2) not later  
20           than 180 days after the date of enactment of this  
21           Act.

22           (d) TERMS OF SERVICE.—

23                 (1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in this  
24                 subsection, each appointed member of the Board of  
25                 Trustees shall be appointed for a term of 3 years.

1                         (2) INITIAL APPOINTEES.—As designated by  
2 the Board of Regents at the time of appointment, of  
3 the voting members first appointed under subparagraph  
4 (E) of subsection (c)(2)—

5                         (A) five members shall be appointed for a  
6 term of 1 year;

7                         (B) five members shall be appointed for a  
8 term of 2 years; and

9                         (C) four members shall be appointed for a  
10 term of 3 years.

11                         (3) REAPPOINTMENT.—A member of the Board  
12 of Trustees may be reappointed, except that no individual  
13 may serve on the Board of Trustees for a  
14 total of more than 2 full terms. For purposes of this  
15 paragraph, the number of terms an individual serves  
16 on the Board of Trustees shall not include any por-  
17 tion of a term for which an individual is appointed  
18 to fill a vacancy under paragraph (4)(B).

19                         (4) VACANCIES.—

20                         (A) IN GENERAL.—A vacancy on the  
21 Board of Trustees—

22                                 (i) shall not affect the powers of the  
23 Board of Trustees; and

24                                 (ii) shall be filled in the same manner  
25 as the original appointment was made.

## **6 (e) COMPENSATION.—**

7                   (1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in para-  
8                   graph (2), a member of the Board of Trustees shall  
9                   serve without pay.

18 (f) CHAIRPERSON.—By a majority vote of its voting  
19 members, the Board of Trustees shall elect a chairperson  
20 from its members.

21 (g) MEETINGS.—

22                   (1) IN GENERAL.—The Board of Trustees shall  
23        meet at the call of the chairperson or on the written  
24        request of a majority of the voting members of the

1       Board of Trustees, but not fewer than twice each  
2       year.

3                     (2) MEETING FORMAT.—Regularly scheduled  
4       meetings and special meetings may be conducted in-  
5       person, telephonically, electronically, or by any  
6       means appropriate as determined by the chairperson.

7                     (h) QUORUM.—A majority of the voting members of  
8       the Board of Trustees holding office shall constitute a  
9       quorum for the purpose of conducting business, but a less-  
10      er number may receive information on behalf of the Board  
11      of Trustees.

12 **SEC. 6. DIRECTOR AND STAFF OF MUSEUM.**

13                     (a) DIRECTOR.—

14                     (1) IN GENERAL.—The Museum shall have a  
15       Director who shall be appointed by the Secretary in  
16       consultation with the Board of Trustees. The Sec-  
17       retary may appoint an interim Director to oversee  
18       the initial activity of establishing the Museum until  
19       a permanent Director is selected.

20                     (2) DUTIES.—The Director shall manage the  
21       Museum subject to the policies of the Board of Re-  
22       gents and the Board of Trustees.

23                     (b) STAFF.—The Secretary may appoint 2 additional  
24       employees to serve under the Director, except that such  
25       additional employees may be appointed without regard to

1 the provisions of title 5, United States Code, governing  
2 appointments in the competitive service.

3 (c) PAY.—The employees appointed by the Secretary  
4 under subsection (b) may be paid without regard to the  
5 provisions of chapter 51 and subchapter III of chapter 53  
6 of title 5, United States Code, relating to classification  
7 of positions and General Schedule pay rates.

8 **SEC. 7. EDUCATIONAL AND LIAISON PROGRAMS.**

9 (a) IN GENERAL.—

10 (1) PROGRAMS AUTHORIZED.—The Director of  
11 the Museum may carry out educational and liaison  
12 programs in support of the goals of the Museum.

13 (2) SPECIFIC ACTIVITIES.—In carrying out this  
14 section, the Director shall—

15 (A) carry out educational programs relat-  
16 ing to Latino life, art, history, and culture, in-  
17 cluding—

18 (i) programs using digital, electronic,  
19 and interactive technologies; and

20 (ii) programs carried out in collabora-  
21 tion with elementary schools, secondary  
22 schools, and postsecondary schools; and

23 (B) consult with the Director of the Insti-  
24 tute of Museum and Library Services con-

1 cerning the grant programs carried out under  
2 subsection (b).

3 (b) GRANT PROGRAMS.—Notwithstanding any other  
4 provision of law, the Director of the Institute of Museum  
5 and Library Services, in consultation with the Museum  
6 Director, is authorized to use funds from the appropria-  
7 tions account appropriated under the heading “OFFICE OF  
8 MUSEUM AND LIBRARY SERVICES: GRANTS AND ADMINIS-  
9 TRATION” under the heading “INSTITUTE OF MUSEUM  
10 AND LIBRARY SERVICES” to award grants in accordance  
11 with the purposes described in section 4(b).

12 **SEC. 8. NATIONAL MUSEUM OF THE AMERICAN LATINO**  
13 **BUILDING AND SUPPORT FACILITIES.**

14 (a) IN GENERAL.—

15 (1) LOCATION.—

16 (A) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 24  
17 months after the date of the enactment of this  
18 Act, the Board of Regents shall designate a site  
19 for the Museum.

20 (B) SITES FOR CONSIDERATION.—In des-  
21 ignating a site under subparagraph (A), the  
22 Board of Regents shall select from among the  
23 following sites in the District of Columbia:

24 (i) The Arts and Industries Building  
25 of the Smithsonian Institution, located on

1                   the National Mall at 900 Jefferson Drive,  
2                   Southwest, Washington, District of Colum-  
3                   bia.

4                   (ii) A vacant area bounded by Inde-  
5                   pendence Avenue, Jefferson Drive, Raoul  
6                   Wallenberg Place, and 14th Street South-  
7                   west, currently under the jurisdiction of  
8                   the National Park Service.

9                   (iii) The area bounded by 3rd Street  
10                  and 1st Street, Northwest, and Constitu-  
11                  tion Avenue and Pennsylvania Avenue,  
12                  Northwest, as measured from curb to curb,  
13                  currently under the jurisdiction of the Ar-  
14                  chitect of the Capitol.

15                  (iv) The facility and grounds on the  
16                  National Mall between 12th and 14th  
17                  Streets, Southwest, and Jefferson Drive  
18                  and Independence Avenue, Southwest, cur-  
19                  rently under the jurisdiction of the Depart-  
20                  ment of Agriculture.

21                  (v) Any other appropriate location as  
22                  identified by the Board of Trustees or  
23                  Board of Regents.

24                  (C) TRANSFER TO SMITHSONIAN INSTITU-  
25                  TION.—Except with respect to a site described

1           in clause (i) of subparagraph (B), if the site  
2           designated for the Museum is in an area that  
3           is under the administrative jurisdiction of an-  
4           other Federal entity, as soon as practicable  
5           after the date on which the designation is made,  
6           the head of the Federal entity shall transfer to  
7           the Smithsonian Institution administrative ju-  
8           risdiction over the area selected for the site of  
9           the Museum.

10                 (D) CONSULTATION.—The Board of Re-  
11                 gents shall carry out its duties under this para-  
12                 graph in consultation with the following:

13                             (i) The Chair of the National Capital  
14                         Planning Commission.

15                             (ii) The Chair of the Commission of  
16                         Fine Arts.

17                             (iii) The Chair and Vice Chair of the  
18                         Commission referred to in section 9.

19                             (iv) The Chair of the Building and  
20                         Site Subcommittee of the Commission re-  
21                         ferred to in section 9.

22                             (v) The Chair and ranking minority  
23                         member of each of the following Commit-  
24                         tees:

6 (III) The Committee on Trans-  
7 portation and Infrastructure of the  
8 House of Representatives.

12 (V) The Committee on Appro-  
13 priations of the Senate.

14 (vi) The Architect of the Capitol.

1                             (3) NONAPPLICABILITY OF PROVISIONS RELAT-  
2                             ING TO MONUMENTS, COMMEMORATIVE, AND OTHER  
3                             WORKS ON THE NATIONAL MALL.—Chapter 89 of  
4                             title 40, United States Code, shall not apply with re-  
5                             spect to the Museum.

6                             (b) COST SHARING.—The Board of Regents shall  
7                             pay—

8                             (1) 50 percent of the costs of carrying out this  
9                             section from Federal funds; and

10                           (2) 50 percent of the costs of carrying out this  
11                             section from non-Federal sources.

12 **SEC. 9. CONSIDERATION OF RECOMMENDATIONS OF COM-**  
13                             **MISSION.**

14                             In carrying out their duties under this Act, the Board  
15                             of Trustees and the Board of Regents shall take into con-  
16                             sideration the reports and plans submitted by the Commis-  
17                             sion to Study the Potential Creation of a National Mu-  
18                             seum of the American Latino established under section  
19                             333 of the Consolidated Natural Resources Act of 2008  
20                             (Public Law 110–229; 122 Stat. 784).

21 **SEC. 10. CONGRESSIONAL BUDGET ACT COMPLIANCE.**

22                             Authority under this Act to enter into contracts or  
23                             to make payments shall be effective in any fiscal year only  
24                             to the extent provided in advance in an appropriations  
25                             Act.

1   **SEC. 11. AUTHORIZATION OF FUNDING.**

2       (a) MUSEUM CONSTRUCTION.—Notwithstanding any  
3 other provision of law, the Board of Regents is authorized  
4 to allocate funds from the appropriations account appro-  
5 priated under the heading “FACILITIES CAPITAL” under  
6 the heading “SMITHSONIAN INSTITUTION” for design,  
7 planning, and construction of the Museum established by  
8 this Act.

9       (b) MUSEUM OPERATION.—Notwithstanding any  
10 other provision of law, the Board of Regents is authorized  
11 to allocate funds from the appropriations account appro-  
12 priated under the heading “SALARIES AND EXPENSES”  
13 under the heading “SMITHSONIAN INSTITUTION” for the  
14 operation of the Museum established by this Act.

15       (c) USE OF FUNDS FOR FUNDRAISING.—Amounts  
16 appropriated pursuant to the authorization under this sec-  
17 tion may be used to conduct fundraising in support of the  
18 Museum from private sources.
