A BILL

To amend section 520E of the Public Health Service Act to require States and their designees receiving grants for development and implementation of statewide suicide early intervention and prevention strategies to collaborate with each Federally recognized Indian tribe, tribal organization, and urban Indian organization in the State.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Native American Sui-
3 cide Prevention Act of 2017”.

4 **SEC. 2. COLLABORATION WITH FEDERALLY RECOGNIZED**
5 **INDIAN TRIBES, TRIBAL ORGANIZATIONS,**
6 **AND URBAN INDIAN ORGANIZATIONS IN DE-**
7 **VELOPMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF**
8 **STATEWIDE SUICIDE EARLY INTERVENTION**
9 **AND PREVENTION STRATEGIES.**

10 Subsection (e) of section 520E of the Public Health
11 Service Act (42 U.S.C. 290bb–36) is amended by adding
12 at the end the following:

13 “(4) COLLABORATION WITH FEDERALLY RE-
14 COGNIZED INDIAN TRIBES, TRIBAL ORGANIZATIONS,
15 AND URBAN INDIAN ORGANIZATIONS.—As a condi-
16 tion on the receipt of a grant or cooperative agree-
17 ment under this section for development and imple-
18 mentation of a statewide early intervention and pre-
19 vention strategy, a State or an eligible entity des-
20 ignated by a State pursuant to subsection (b)(1)(B)
21 shall agree to collaborate with each Federally recog-
22 nized Indian tribe and tribal organization (as de-
23 fined in the Indian Self-Determination and Edu-
24 cation Assistance Act) and each urban Indian orga-
25 nization (as defined in the Indian Health Care Im-

1 provement Act) in the State regarding such develop-
2 ment and implementation.”.
