- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Air Traffic Noise and
- 5 Pollution Expert Consensus Act of 2017".

1	SEC. 2. HEALTH IMPACTS OF AIR TRAFFIC NOISE AND POL-
2	LUTION.
3	(a) Study.—The Administrator of the Federal Avia-
4	tion Administration shall enter into appropriate arrange-
5	ments with the Health and Medicine Division of the Na-
6	tional Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine
7	under which the Division will—
8	(1) not later than 30 days after the date of en-
9	actment of this Act, convene a committee of experts
10	in health and environmental science to examine the
11	various health impacts of air traffic noise and pollu-
12	tion; and
13	(2) issue a corresponding expert consensus re-
14	port that sets forth current scientific knowledge re-
15	lating to the various health impacts of air traffic
16	noise and pollution.
17	(b) Report.—Upon completion, the Division shall
18	transmit the report to—
