1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Current Employee3 Representation Act".

4 SEC. 2. FILING AND TREATMENT OF PETITIONS FOR CER5 TIFICATION OF BARGAINING REPRESENTA6 TIVE.

7 (a) PETITION DESCRIBED.—Section 9(c)(1) of the
8 National Labor Relations Act (29 U.S.C. 159(c)(1)) is
9 amended—

10 (1) in subparagraph (A), by striking "or" at11 the end;

12 (2) in subparagraph (B), by adding "or" at the13 end; and

14 (3) by inserting after subparagraph (B) the fol-15 lowing new subparagraph:

"(C) by an employee or a group of employees or any individual or labor organization acting in their behalf, or an employer, alleging
that the labor organization that has been certified or is currently recognized by the employer
as the bargaining representative is no longer a
representative as defined in subsection (a), if—

"(i) fewer than 50 percent of the members of the bargaining unit in question had an opportunity to vote in the certification election that resulted in certifying

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1	the labor organization then recognized as
2	the bargaining representative for such
3	unit; or
4	"(ii) no certification election was con-
5	ducted regarding such unit;".
6	(b) EXISTENCE OF QUESTION OF REPRESENTA-
7	TION.—Section 9(c)(2) of the National Labor Relations
8	Act (29 U.S.C. $159(c)(2)$) is amended by adding at the
9	end the following: "When a petition is filed under para-
10	graph $(1)(C)$, a question of representation affecting com-
11	merce exists if the petitioner establishes the existence of
12	the circumstances described in paragraph $(1)(C)(i)$ or
13	paragraph (1)(C)(ii).".
